One language that says it all
Warren school offers course in universal communication

At a time when world leaders are trying to talk their way out of a war in the Persian Gulf, a Warren man is promoting a language he says is spoken throughout the globe. Wesley Arnold, an adult education teacher for Warren Consolidated, is teaching *Esperanto* as part of the weekly Adult Enrichment series at the Butcher Community Education Center.

Created in the late 1800s by Polish Dr. Ludwigo Zamenhof, *Esperanto* is a combination of such European languages as Italian and Spanish. It often is suggested as a language for international travelers and for those who correspond with "pen pals" in other nations, Arnold said.

A elementary school teacher by trade, Arnold describes *Esperanto* as "a scientific language that works."

Although English is a primary language in many tourist spots, he believes *Esperanto* is gaining popularity worldwide and hopes to create
