Note the bottom inside quarter of this diary book was damaged thru the years and is unreadable so there will be a lot of text missing. I have added the Year and month and indented them for easier reference.

1882 Jan Wens 4 quite a windy wintery day a very chilly east wind. We were taking the ashes & other trash out of the cellar & covering the outside door

1882 Jan Thurs 5 A pleasant winter day. Eyprodical fast day. We attended prayer Meeting at the school house morn-g & even-g. Mother stopt with Emma Jameson. Vi & I at R J Jameson Rbt went up home today.

1882 Jan Frid 6 The wind was in the east this morn-g. changed to the west & blowed quite cold in the afternoon. I took a load of wood over to Mtgomery & got 4 shoes put on the horses, M E Cartwright cr by shoeing 1.00 Recd of Frank Moffat for a cord of wood 1.00 Henry Up de to drawing a load of wood .20 Jas Nobles cr by crackers goods Abt put up a grist split wood &c

1882 Jan Sat 7 A dark foggy morn-g cmcd raining shortly after noon but not very hard. Rbt was splitting and putting wood in the wood house &c I was out to Fremont to Mill Took 15 bush rye Paid Farmham for 10th .75 Paid Cal Merwin for 2 hold back steaks .40 He is to be cr by 44 lbs oil cake 0.2 ½ half 1.00Philip Michael for pipe & oil .40

1882 Jan 8 Dark & cloudy with ...rain. We did not go to church on account of bad weather

1882 Jan 9 A pleasant winter day.up again last nightsome today Rbt was underbrushing puling wood &c I drawed 2 loads of wood over to Mtgomery. Recd of Jas Nobles in trade for a cord of wood 1.00 Recd of Jos Gifford for a cord of wood 1.00 Paid Aaron Kellog for a jacket .25 Settled general bill & accts with S Chillcothe Recd cash to bal .25

1882 Jan Tues 10 pleasant in the fore-n comced snowing from the East quite hard

about 2 p m Robt was puling wood cut brush &c, I was over to Mtgomery with 2 loads of wood in the fore-n S Chilleothe dr to a cord of wood 1.00 Jas Nobles dr to a cord of wood 1.00 cr by cother .35 shoes \$1.25 to return of brush 1.60

1882 Jan Wens 11 quite a cool S wind & west wind. There was about 3 in of snow fell in the storm of yesterday. Robt was puling wood fixing hen house, &c I was drawing wood over to Mtgomery today Jas Nobles dr to a cord of wood 1.00 & a pair of shoes returned 1.25 Recd of Byron Whitney for a cord of wood 1.00 Recd of Frank Moffet for cord of wood 1.00

1882 Jan 12 quite a chilly S east wind, Robt was out hunting. Vi & I attended services Missionary Meeting at R V Jamesons

1882 Jan Frid 13 A light sleet storm last night, cloudy today, wind in all ...with squalls of mist & snow ...went over to Ira Adams after a load of dude filing crosscut saws, &c Angus was here this morn-g

1882 Jan Sat 14 A very cold West wind today I finished filing the saw this fore-n. we were drawing wood & straw in the PM Angus called a while to day ce by cash 3.00 Was up to Hall's Corners this even-g Paid W. T. Ellis for sugar coffee & tea 1.30

1882 Jan Sab 15 A fine day. Thawed some through the day. A light mist or rain this even-g we were out to Sab School and Prayer Meeting Went back again in the even-g

1882 Jan Mon 16 quite a cold chilly North wind. We were cuting wood underbrushing &c. Angus called here today I helped him drive his hogs home, I was up to Hall's Corners this even-g W. T. Ellis ce by oysters & crackers 2.75 I got these for a party to be held at Angus tomorrow night by our Society

1882 Jan Tues 17 quite a cold N & West wind rained today. I went out to Reading with Aurthur Woodward today Robt was cuting & drawing wood George and Clara Vi & I attended an oyster supper at Angus this even-g. Paid W. T. Ellis by Renwidk Jameson for oysters & crackers got last night 2.75 Paid Buell of Reading for gloves 1.50

1882 Jan Wed 18 A chilly S West wind we were drawing & cuting wood &c I took Mother over to Angus this morn-g went after her this even-g

1882 Jan Thrs 19 A fine winter day. Robt was at work with wood. I went over to Coldwater with Arth Woodwd ...his fathers estate...Walter Morrow rode out with us.[neg 111]

1882 Jan Thurs 19 continued Took the insurance policy out to Coldwater with me & had the kitchen included in it. Paid for a whip tape. 50 & cloth for Shirt \$1.00 1.50 Paid P M Ryan subscription for the Michigan Farmer for 3 months .35 Took his receipt for the house Lent Walter Morrow cash .50

1882 Jan Frid 20 A pleasant day. We were up to Hall's Corners butchering a beef for Mrs Greer Went & came by R J Jamesons to take Vi there & bring her home We weighted the hog this even-g I have fed her 54 days. She weighed 200 lbs when we shut her up to fat & she weighed 360 lbs today. The first 18 days she gained 72 lbs. The next 18 days she gained 54 lbs The next 18 days she gained 34 lbs, total 168 gain an average of 3 lbs per day lacking 2 lbs

1882 Jan Sat 29 A cloudy day with light flurries of snow Angus & I were butchering hogs at his place today. He killed 2 & myself 2

Sab 22 A cold day with high West wind & squalls of snow We did not go to church on account of storm

1882 Jan Mon 23 quite cold but pleasant Robt was drawing wood for thresh straw for feed, &c I was helping Wm Holley thresh after 10 a m helped him thresh wheat aftern ...Taters & clover seed at

1882 Jan Tues 24 Ther stood at zero at 5 Oclock in the morn-g moderated through the day. I helped Wm Holley finish threshing his clover seed today. Arthur Woodard & Wm Holley helped us We threshed it out in less than ½ a day I had about 8 acres of seed threshed

1882 Jan Wens 25 Wind in the east commenced raining about 9 O'clock am I was making a meat bench cutng up the pnk &c, Robt was doing chores &c

1882 Jan Thurs 26 Rained the most of the day. Robt & I rode up to Hall's Corners with Wm Holley W. T. Ellis ce by bill of groceries 2.73

1882 Jan Frid 27 A fine day. Robt was helping Angus cut wood I was salting pork &c. Newt Woodards folks came here from Ruths this morn-g Sold 29 sheep & lambs to Saml Chillonthe & Rb Masters for sum jof 55.00 to be delivered at Mtgomery next Fridy Recd cash on the same. One dollar

1882 Jan Sat 28 Pleasant but quite windy. Newt folks started for home this eveng. we were grinding tools drawing straw, &c &c.

1882 Jan Sab 29 Ther 10 above zero at 6 this morn-g. quite a strong wind in... part of the day. Rbt & I went out to Sab School and Preaching on foot. Services by JR Wylie of Tuscola Co Mich. [neg 112]

1882 Jan Mon 30 A pleasant winter day. ...cuting wood & underbrushing ... yesterday by Angus

1882 Jan Mon 30 I was over to Mtgomery today Recd of Wm Peters for threshing Aug 30 .75 Recd of Saml Chillonthe for a cord of wood 1.00 Paid Aaron Kellog for an ax & helve 1.35 Doct Miner called to see the baby today.

1882 Jan Tues 31 A fine day. We were butchering a beef today a 2 year old Hefer Angus was over helping us, We had to call Dr Minor in the night for Georgie

1882 Feb Wend 1 A pleasant day. But quite windy. We were over to Angus in the morn-g. Brought up a load of wood when we came home Mother & I attended prayer Meeting at Saml Jamesons in the afternoon Was over to Mtgomery in the even-g Recd of Saml Chillonthe no ce by oil, wicking & tobacco .40 J A Selfridge de to 100 lbs beef at .06 @ 6.00sent same to him by rail road

1882 Feb Thurs 2 A fine day. We were over to Angus this morn-g but did not find him at home, Came back & Robt went home to see his aunt I took in a pit of potatoes, &c Rbt came home this eve & I took the team & went with him to take his aunt to his grandmothers Sent Wm Holley for a few days cash

1882 Feb Frid 3 A fine day. Robt & I went over to Mtgomery with sheep sold to Rbt Masters last Friday, He could...take them on the contract, Resold them for .03 ½ cts per lb Recd for 1440 lbsThere was 8 sheep weighed 74013 lambs weighing 80 lbs

1882 Feb 3 [continued] Robt & I attended a National Reform Meeting at Parmertain Corners this evening Paid John Jameson by his step mother 29.80 the ball due him for work with interest from Dec 3 81 Doc Miner was here to see Georgie this even-g

1882 Feb Sat 4 A fine day. Robt & I took Angus sheep home this fore-n I brought our calves home & was over to Mtgomery, cut up & salted the beef in the afternoon. Rbt was at odds and ends Paid Hoag the cooper for a large puk bas 1.50 Recd of Wm Holley on cash lent Thursday 1.50 Angus Stewart cr by 25 lbs of Rock Salt

1882 Feb Sab 5 A dark cloudy morn-g but a pleasant day, we were out to Sab School and Preaching. Services by Rev J R Wylie. He preached at Angus this even-g

1882 Feb Mon 6 A fine day. Hollys boys & us were clearing clover seed I had 8 bush out of 13 from the mach'ne We put a grist this evening, wheat,& rye

1882 Feb Tues 7 A cloudy day with squalls of rain. I started for Mill this morn-g went about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile & turned back on acct of rain, I finished cutting up & salting beef & Rbt cut wood in the fore-n . Did not work out on acct of rain in PM Dr Miner called to see Georgie today [neg 113]

1882 Feb Wed 8 Rbt was helping Angus. I was out to Fremont to the Mill. Paid Warren Willkinson for money 5.70 ...sen in favor of J A McHee Pitsburg Pa ...Milton taken up for Domestic Mipm....Gilbert for trade \$1.25 ce by pair shoes 1.80....Paul for drugs pencils well I never &c 1.25 ...Milhad for nails & finksing .50

1882 Feb Thurs 9 A fine day. Rbt helped Angus draw straw this even-g working in the swamp the east of today Vi & I attended Ladies Missionary Society meeting at R J Jamesons. Tem & us spent the even-g at Rbt Jamesons Paid W. T. Ellis for $\frac{1}{2}$ gallon of Mdapes [or Nlapes] .30

1882 Feb Frid 10 A fine day. I was confined to the house with a heavy cold Robt was underbrushing Dr Miner called to see Georgie today

1882 Feb 11 Sat A find day I was not fit to work Robert Was under brushing Robert Logan Called here this afternoon

1882 Feb 12 Threatened rain But did not amount to anything We were out to Sab school and prayer meeting

1882 Feb Monday 13 A fine day Remained quite hard last night. We were under brushing Any cutting wood In the fore-n We were showing would in stems I took our Hamm was up to Arthurs to Smoke in the PM William Monlux de To cash 30, August 27 4.00 Paid this to Ben Estelow I'm order Gordon Clark & Chas Quackenbush Team here this evening To stay all night

1882 Feb Tues 14 A fine day Robert under brushed And I took G. Clark took home in the fore-n I came home by the Corners We were cutting wood and underbrush in in the afternoon Robert went over to help grandfather this evening William Ben.... came here this evening to stay Recd of W. Morrow by William Beaks cash [neg 114]

1882 Feb Wednesday 15 A fine day. I was under brushing and cutting wood. Robert did not get home until this evening. Mother Vi an I went up to Mr. Samuel Jameson's this even-g to Dick Garelner Blacks folks Jonesville. They are to start for their home and Iowa in the morning.

1882 Feb Thurs 16 A dark showery day. Robert was tinkering and underbrushing I was over to Montgomery in the fore n was helping the women in the afternoon Jas noble cr by pair of children's shoes 1.00

1882 Feb Frid 17 A cold east wind Robert and I were underbrushing and cutting wood.

1882 Feb Sat 18 froze some last night a cold east wind today we were

underbrushing and cutting wood and straw. &c in the afternoon. Dr. Miner called to see Georgie today. Newt Woodward called this afternoon.

1882 Feb Sab 19 rained some through the night showery in the morning faired up in the after part of the day. We were not out to Sab school.

1882 Feb Mon 20 cloudy with quite a strong east wind. Commenced raining and freezing in the afternoon. We were splitting up wood and putting it in the woodshed tell stopped by rain. I went over to Ira Adams after a hog belonging to Theodore McNaughton.

1882 Feb Tues 21 the wind turned to the southwest snowed and blowed all day. I was up to Hall's Corners. Paid WT Ellis for trade by RobertBought Theo Mcnaughtons for \$4100.

1882 Feb Weds 22 not very cold but the trees were so loaded with ice we could not work in the woods. We were at odds and ends around the house.

1882 Feb Thurs 23 a pleasant day we rigged up the sleigh and went over to Angus after the barley fork & were going to to draw clover chaff. But the lane was so soft we had to give that up. Angus folks were over and spent the afternoon and evening. Phebe came with them.

1882 Feb Frid 24 a fine day. We were cutting wood in the fore-n Robert went up home and George and Clara Vi and I spent the afternoon and evening at Walter Morrow's. Borrowed from cash \$5.00.

1882 25 a fine day. We were drawing clover chaff wood and straw in the fore-n. Sawed wood in the afternoon, when I had to stop to fix Angus's is saw brought by Charlie Quackenbush Robert Greer started for home, this evening paid William Monlux by Robert Greer \$4.81 on thrashing done August 27, 82. A 10 mn Ewe had a lamb

1882 Feb Sat 26 cloudy and threatened rain in the morning. But did not amount to anything. We were out to Sabbath school and prayer meeting.

1882 Feb Mon 27 A fine day. We were cutting wood filing saws etc. Eliza Morrow came here in this PM.

1882 Feb Tues 28. A dark cloudy day. Rained some in the fore-n and hard in the afternoon. But when Eliza went home this AM. Sent for Dr. Miner to see Georgie this PM.

1882 Mar Wens 1 A fine day. We cut wood in the fore-n. Robert underbrushed in the afternoon, And mother and I attended society at Fred Staley's. Robert and I were over to Montgomery this evening. Paid RR Moris for sugar tea coffee etc. 1.30 Sold E L French six I/2 bush clover seed at \$4.55 per bushel of number nine, received on the same \$25.00 He has to send me word when to deliver.

1882 Mar Thurs 2 A very warm day. We were cutting wood, I called at J Heights this evening. Borrowed of him cash \$30.00 I am to return it in a few days.

1882 Mar Frid 3 A fine day. We were cutting wood etc. I went over to Angus's this morning to pay a William Beaks borrowing. He failed to meet me there I left \$50.00 with Mrs. Angus Stewart to pay him on the notes given to him by me. Mother Vi & I spent the evening at T Mc. K.

1882 Mar Sat 4 stormed the most of the fore-n fared up in the afternoon. We were at various things in the PM. Robert Logan was here and took dinner.

1882 Mar Sab 5 A fine day. We were out to Sab the school and prayer meeting.

1882 Mar Mon 6 quite a cold west wind I was over to Montgomery in the fore-n. We cut wood in the afternoon. Was up to Hall's Corners in evening. Received of EL French for 6.32 lb clover seed 29.87 This includes cash received March 1. Paid WT Ellis for trade 1.78 Ladies Missionary Society .30 thread 20 ...

1882 Mar Tues 7 quite cold, thermometer below freezing we were cutting wood Mother Vi and I took tea at William Holly's.

1882 Mar Wens 8 froze quite hard last night. We were drawing manure on to the south side of the field south of the orchard.

1882 Mar Thurs 9 A wet day rained very hard part of the time mother Vi & I attended Ladies Missionary Society Angus' I called at Walter Morrow's and left with his wife cash borrowed Feb 24 5.00 N R Woodard's family came here this evening.

1882 Mar Frid 10 cold and cloudy with flurries of snow. Robert was underbrushing. Newts folks started for home at 11:00 AM. I was up to Joseph Hackerman's and over to Albert Nichols in the afternoon.

1882 Mar Sat 11 A cold air and cloudy. We were drawing wood and straw in the fore-n. Robert was splitting wood in the afternoon. Phillip Felkey, Walter Morrow and wife were here today.

1882 Mar Sab 12 quite a cold wind. We were out to Sab school and preaching services by Rev. J.R. Wiley.

1882 Mar Mon 13 quite cold with squalls of snow. Robert was running around after a pair of rubber boots. I was ditching for Albert Nichols to pay back balance due for the use of drillVi and I spent the evening at T. McNaughtons. Their child has been very sick. WT Ellis Ce by a pair of...

Robert Greer to pair of......

1882 Mar Tues 14 A pleasant day but cold air Robert and I were ditching for Albert nobles. I gave him what we done today. Bid Mc Clue took dinner with us today. Mr Wylie came here this evening.

1882 Mar Wens 15 there was between two and 3 inches of snow fell last night. Cloudy with squalls of frozen rain on the log I was over to Montgomery in the fore-n. Took Mr. Wyley and mother over on the south street this evening Robert brother spent Tuesday there Robert Logan called here this afternoon. Borrowed of Jean Dobbs for a few days \$10.00 Borrowed of C L French for a few days \$20.00 paid James Haight back amt borrowed March third \$30.00.

1882 Mar Thurs 16 pleasant but cold air Robert and I were ditching for Albert Nobles. We put in about 8 hours apiece.

1882 Mar Frid 17 A pleasant day. We were ditching for Albert Nobles in the foren put in 5 hours apeace. Attended eatuhizing [yes that is what it says] at Angus' is in the afternoon services by Rev. R Wyley. Mother came home with us in the evening Angus is credit by 90 pounds feed burrowed of him.

1882 Mar Sat 18 cloudy with thunder and lights squalls and rain. Had a thundershower last night. Robert and I were up to the Corners this fore-n. I ditched 4

hours for Albert Nobles in the afternoon. Robert done the chores etc. We had a chill last night. Paid WT Ellis for dry goods groceries etc. \$3.80 Paid Heidi McNnaughton for seed wheat \$7.02 paid him for the rest of the hog \$1.00 ...Paid for.Son R Bradley by trade McNnaughton \$3.50favor of Jackson A Palmer. [neg 115]

1882 Mar Sat 19 A fine day. We were out to sab school and prayer meeting. Fore-n

1882 Mar Mon 20 cloudy and commenced raining shortly after nine in the morning. We worked in the ditch for A Nobles about 9 and 1/2 hours apeace.

1882 Mar Tues 21 a very strong west wind with squalls of snow. I was over to Montgomery Paid Jean Dobbs cash borrowed March 15, 10 dollars Aaron Kellog credit by a shovel \$1.00 cash \$5.00 received of William Holly balance on cash interest 50¢.

1882 Mar Wens 22 A cold chilly West wind. We were ditching for Albert Nobels. Worked $6\frac{1}{2}$ hr apiece.

 $1882\ Mar\ Thurs\ 23\ Thawed\ today\ wind\ southwest.$ We ditched $\,6$ hours apeace for Albert Nichols. Drawed wood etc. Angus' called & took dinner with us. Vi and I went up to R J

Jameson's this evening.

1882 Mar Frid 24 quite a cold chilly north wind today. Attended R.J. Jameson's. Auction Robert was up to the sale and to the Corners I bought a dollar 58 worth at the sale.

1882 Mar Sat 25 quite cold froze quite hard last night had quite a snowstorm about noon. I was over to Mtgomery in the Fore-n. And up to R.J. Jameson's in the afternoon. Robert was up to Sold C J French 30 bushels more or less of a red wheat at a dollar 25 per bushel. I am to deliver any time next week. Borrowed of Brnt Myers for a short time 5.80 Paid Aaron Kellog cash barrowed... all he has credit by hand apiece for show....

1882 Mar Sab 26 A pleasant day. We were out to sabath school and prayer meeting.

1882 Mar Mon 27 A strong west wind. Robert was underbrushing and I went up to R J. Jameson's to help him pack up. Renwick, Rose, Everett and Clyde came home with me from F Staley's. I ate dinner at Fred's.

1882 Mar Tues 28 A fine day. Robert was spreading manure and I took R J Jameson's folks home this morning and took a load of goods over to State line for them. They are going to move to Tuscola County. They sold their farm of 15.8 acres to Thomas Hall for 9000 dollars.

1882 Mar Wens 29 cloudy and warm. We ditched in the fore n. Robert went to Hall's Corners and I ditched part of the afternoon. Cleaned out the grainery and brought the Tanning mill from **Arthur's** after Robert got home I Ditched 6 hours for A. Nichols and Robert 3 ½.

1882 Mar Thurs 30 pleasant but a quite cold west wind. We were cleaning up wheat in the fore n. Robert was underbrushing and Vi and I attended a S school meeting at the school house in the afternoon for the purpose of the electing officers. came home by Angus' is and spent the evening.

1882 Mar Frid 31. A fine day. Robert was drawing wood and I was sewing clover seed in the field north of RR and west of lane in the fore-n. I took a load of wheat

over to Montgomery. And Robert split would at the house. In the afternoon. I took a cord of wood over to Robert's mother in the evening. [from neg 117]

1882 Mar Frid 31 {continued] received of C I French for 25 bushels wheat \$39.45 paid him cash borrowed March 15 20 dollars paid Bert Myers cash borrowed \$5.00.

1882 Apr Sat 1 a fine warm day. Robert and was splitting wood filling back etc. And I took a load of wood over to the Jas Nobles of Montgomery making five chords in all drawn to him I drawed two loads for myself in the fore-n. Took a load of wood up to the Mrs. Greer I took Ira Adams Adams pilow home in the afternoon. Arthur use old boy today. Received of WT Ellis last evening in trade 44 dozen eggs 48¢ paid Erin Holly for poimbs 80¢ and Arron Kellog credit by Jointer to follow \$2.00

1882 Apr Sab 2 A fine day. Therm 76 at 3:00 PM We were out to sab school and prayer meeting.

1882 Apr Mon 3 A fine day. We drawed manure off the potato pit. Took in the potatoes 6 ½ bus of good ones & 3 of pon [?]ones. Plowed a patch in the garden for potatoes & plowed and sowed part of the little lot to rye for the calf pasture this summer

1882 Apr Tues 4 A fine warm day a light shower in the morning we planted a patch of potatoes was in the garden in the morning. Cut and split rails the rest of the fore-n. Robert was underbrushing and I went out to Fremont to Mill in the afternoon took 12 bushels rye and four bushels of wheat went out to Newts to stay overnight.

1882 Apr Wens 5 rained quite hard last night slacked off about nine this morning but kept cloudy all day. I got home about 2 ½ o'clock PM paid Dr. Hagarty for med's for Vi. 50¢ Received of Charles Gilbert in trade for shoes &c. Paid WW Wilkinson for post office order 1.60 The same to Josh vic of Rochester New York. Attended prayer meeting and Missionary meeting at Angus' after I got home. Robert Logan came home with me this evening. WW Wilkinson's credit by bottle of Warner's meds 1.25 pills 25¢.

1882 Apr 6 showery in the fore-n. Pleasant and warm in the afternoon mother Vi and I were over to Mr. Logan's Robert Logan went home with us. George and I Robert were helping the Holly brothers divide their personal property this afternoon.

1882 Apr Frid 7 a find day. We were cutting and splitting rails to fix the line fence between Charles Reynolds and myself in the afternoon. Drawed a load of wood and Robert tore down the line fence after drawing rails. Paid M G Cartwright blacksmith account to date \$1.00 Newt Woodard called here this evening.

1882 Apr Sat 8 quite a cold east wind but pleasant. We were drawing wood laying over fence etc. Took mother over to Angus' this afternoon. Return to Angus' feed burrowed. Paid WT Ellis by Robert for half pound of tea 30 cents.

came home with them. J.W. Jameson called here this afternoon.

1882 Apr Wens 12 not quite as cold today. Robert was splitting wood and I was up to the Corners in the fore-n. Took a load of wood up to Mrs Greer this fore-n. Making 3 ¼ chords in all about \$1.00 each total \$3.25. This is to apply on interest on a note for January 8 81. Paid WT Ellis for groceries etc. 40¢ paid the harness maker for H straps 30¢.

1882 Apr Thurs 13 quite cool but pleasant. We were logging up around the little swamp in Cornfield drawing rails etc.. The women attended missionary meeting at Mr. Staley's today. They rode over with Angus' and I went after them this evening.

1882 Apr Frid 14 quite the chilly north wind. We were cleaning and putting up a grist in the morning. I went over to Camden Center to after tile took four bushel rye and eight oats Robert was repairing fence.

The Frid 14 the Angus' was here and spent the evening paid for the 2 lap tile at Camden center. Bor-rowed of George W. Whitley for 90 days \$25.00 Gave my note for the same with 10% interest.

Sat 15 A pleasant day. But cold air. Robert was at the Corners the most of the day. I was plowing for oats at Angus'. George's folks and Vi were out to Fremont today. Paid WT Ellis by Robert Greer cash on?

1882 Apr Sab 16 A fine day. but quite a cool air. We were out to sab school and preaching services by Rev. J R Wylie.

1882 Apr Mon 17 A fine day. Robert was repairing fences. I was plowing and Angus'.

1882 Apr Tues 18 A fine day. Robert was repairing fences. I helped Angus' about ½ fore-n making about two days in all. He finished sowing his piece of oats about noon. I plowed on the fence north of his orchard for myself the rest of the day. Lloyd plowed about 1/3 afternoon for me.

1882 Apr Wens 19 Rained some through the night threatened it in the fore-n. And rained most of the afternoon. We put up seed oats. I cleaned at the back yard in the fore-n. I went over to Angus' to plow in the PM, but did not on account of rain. Lloyd came home with me. [neg 119]

1882 Apr Thurs 20 A blustery day with quite a strong west wind and flurries, and snow. Robert and I were out to Fremont, Angus' went out with us. Rev. J Wylie? came home with us this evening.

1882 Apr Thurs 20 [continued] paid Charles Gilbert on store account \$10.00 Paid him for sugar T coffee etc. \$2.35

He is credited by a suit of clothes for myself \$13.50

Also a suit of clothes for Robert with collars and tie \$13.50

Robert Greer is Dr to me for clothes I got of Gilbert \$13.50

Phillip Michael credit by a corn planter \$7.00

1882 Apr Frid 21 a fine day. Mother and I went over to Mr. Sargent with Rev. J.R. Whitley in the fore-n. I plowed for oats at Angus' in the afternoon. Angus' plowed for me today. Vi rode over to Angus' with me and Georgie came home with us. Robert cleaned out the ditch in the garden piled lumber etc.

1882 Apr Sat 22 a dark cloudy day with a strong chilly east wind and squalls of fine sleet or frozen rain. Robert was burning logs heaps and stumps. I was plowing for

oats at Angus'. Angus' concluded that he with not sow the ground to oats but plant it to corn. He is to give me 2 ½ day team.

1882 Apr Sab 23 quite a cold strong east wind. We were out to sab school and preaching services by Rev. JR Whitley.

1882 Apr Mon 24 quite cold this morning. Thermometer stood at 30 this morning, with a cold east wind. We were drawing men or, rails etc.. Page AR Whitley on cell RE \$17.00

1882 Apr Thurs 25 thermometer stood at 80 this morning. We were drawing manure in the fore-n. Robert called the? Was in the orchard and George and wife Vi and I were out to Fremont in the PM. Return to Charles Gilbert a? Pants got the 20th on account of fit dr to same \$2.75.

1882 Apr Wens 26 a cold eastern storm today. Had rain, sleet and snow. Faired up between eight and 4:00 PM. We were shelling seed corn etc. I went over to Angus' after it fared up. Came home by Ira Adams he is credited by bushel of oats.

1882 Apr Thurs 27 a fine day. We were lowering the cellar drain and laying tile. John Staley called here today.

1882 Apr Frid 28 rained last night cloudy with quite a strong southwest wind part of the time. Finished laying tile about 10:00 AM and I commenced plowing for corn. Robert cultivated the back rows in the orchard and I sold them two oats. There was about 1 ¾ acre.

1882 Apr Sat 29. A find day. Robert was over to Montgomery in the fore-n. I was burning stumps and trash in the afternoon. I was plowing for corn. If I was up to the Corners in the fore-n. Received of WT Ellis in trade for butter and eggs \$1.45. Robert Logan called and took dinner with us. Robert Greer Dr to have bushel of potatoes 50¢.

1882 Apr Sab 30 froze some last night quite a cold west wind today. We were out to sab school and prayer meeting.

1882 May Mon 1 a light scale of ice on water this morning. A very strong west wind and southwest wind part of today, with a shower from the west, between three and four in PM. Angus' & I were plowing for corn. Robert was plowing and burning stumps etc. He went over to Hall's Corners this evening. He is dr it to work 25¢. [neg 120]

1882 May Tues 2 Ther Stood at 38 this morning. Froze considerable last night Angus' and I Were plowing for corn Robert was burning stumps digging out and picking. Insured Topy and Pegy my work horses in the American national aid service stock association of Indiana. J G W Colburn and WA bloomer agents. I am to pay them for this Friday on the team \$2.00. insured Toby fore \$150. and Pegy for \$125.

1882 May Wens 3 Ther stood at 38 this morning. Warmed up through the day. Angus' and I were plowing this fore-n. Society met here this afternoon. Angus' plowed a few winds this evening and I plowed till dark. Finished that field. Robert picked stone, grabbed and went to Montgomery Charles Schulz credit by one pair of boot 75¢.

1882 May Thurs 4 rained last night cloudy and commenced to raining about 11:00 AM. We were drawing out manure until stopped by the rain. I helped Williams Holly put down a carpet in PM.

1882 May Frid 5. A cold east wind and cloudy. Water Morrow and wife were here visiting. Phoebe Jameson has been here sense Wednesday rode home with them. Robert was filling the ditch in the garden, plowed out two loads of manure I went over to

Montgomery in the evening. Paid fore beat call.

1882 June Thurs 1 quite a cool air but pleasant. Robert was planting beans and squash and prem Kin seeds and I was over to Montgomery in the AM. Was helping Amos Ordam raise a barn in the afternoon. Robert Logan and wife Haney called here this evening. AP Kellog Dr to 100 pounds old. One. Credit by 5 pounds fence eight nails at 4¢ per pound. Ira Cap is to pay Geo from 4.00 on my clover thrashing bill for two pigs got of me Dec 6 1884.

1883 Jan Wens 31 A cold blustery day. I was grinding and filing the acts. Crosscut saw any helping Robert do the chores.

1883 Feb Thurs 1 of thermometer stood 8° below zero this morning. And 8° above this evening. I went to Hall's corners with Robert to get the mail. Paid Dr. Mclaren for medicine for Mother 50¢. I drove over to Amos Adams this evening.

1883 Feb Frid 2 A stormy day. Snowed from the east the most of the day. Commenced raining this evening. I spent the day tinkering and killing chores. [neg 22]

1883 Feb Sat 3 wind in the east and.... The rest of the time thermometer stood 38 afternoon. There is quite a [lot of?] ice from the rain. I was filing saws etc..... Dan Spere with Charles Holly this day

1883 Feb Sab 4 A pleasant winter day. But we could not go to church on account the ground being a glare of ice from freezing overnight.

1883 Feb Mon 5 thermometer stood at zero this morning. Kept cold and cloudy all day. I was cleaning the clock fixing door locks etc. Robert came back last evening.

1883 Feb Tues 6 A cold frosty morning. Thermometer stood at zero. Moderated through the day. Commence knowing this evening. I was cleaning out the seller etc.. Charles Holly and wife took dinner with us. Paid Marine Crapo balance due on thrashing \$1 00

1883 Feb Wens 7 A pleasant day. But quite cold. The thermometer stood at zero this morning. There was 2 inches or over of snow fell last night. Charles Quackenbush was here and spent the day. He is DR to rat tail file. 25¢.

1883 Feb Thurs 8 A bright sunshiny day. Robert and I were up to the corners this fore-n. I was over to Angus in PM. WT Ellis credit by sugar and coffee \$1.00.

1883 Feb Frid 9 The sun shone all day but a cold air. I was over to Montgomery this fore-n. Helped the women clean the pantry in the afternoon. William Rodgers DR 26 baskets corn at 25¢ to paid for work done on knives and forks got on January 27. Josh Noble credit by Madison and albo....

1883 Feb Sat 10 thermometer 6° below zero at daybreak. Moderated through the day. Commence snowing from the east about 4:00 PM. I helped the women in the foren. Filed a saw for W Morrow in the afternoon. Robert and I were up to halls corners this evening. Paid for rubarb and cream teaton? 80° .

1883 Feb Sab 11 A pleasant day. I went over to Angus' and rode over to Sab school and prayer meeting with them.

1883 Feb Mon 12 A pleasant day. Thawed a little. Angus' and I were out to reading today. Mc Cartwright DR 2 three bushels of corn that year at 0.25 a bushel 75¢. To pay for a swivel clevis got January 26. He is credit by mickeyoak and fasting the Irons on Angus' DR 23 baskets of corn took to MS C. I was over to Montgomery this evening.

1883 Feb Thues 13 Thawed considerable today. Robert and I were up to the corners this fore-n. Was fencing in the straw stock splitting wood etc. in the afternoon.

1883 Feb Wens 14 A dark cloudy day misty in the morning. Commence training about noon with some thunder in the afternoon. I was over to Montgomery in the fore-n. Helped Angus get apples in the PM. Received of Charles Hughes for shoat weighing 160 pounds \$9.60. Paid for several articles at several places 50¢.

1883 Feb Thurs 15 A pleasant day. Commenced misting in the evening. And raining about bedtime. Robert and I were up to the corners this fore-n put up six bushels of wheat. Four of corn and two of rye took it to the mail at Fremont. I carried... Woodward and his buggy from here.... From sits Shaq..................... [Neg than 23]

1883 Feb Frid 16 A dark cloudy day reigned the most of the day. I stayed at Neuts the ground is merely there this evening.

1883 Feb Sat 17 froze up last night with light squalls of snow today. I got home about 8:00 PM folks all well. Still at Fremont I got the horses shod. Paid Peter Hallock

for the same 70¢.

1883 Feb Sab18 A fine day. Thawed a little in the sun. We did not go to church on account of ice.

1883 Feb Mon 19 A pleasant day. Angus was over this morning I went home with him. And went with him over to William Cartwright. Angus' borrowed of him \$280. To be paid the seventh of November 1884. With interest at 0.07 percent annually. Gave his note for the same and I signed with him. I got \$50.00 of it from Angus and am to pay him when he pays the note. Received of the Angus'cash lent to him January 26 \$79.80. Paid him for oats thrashed last fall \$2.00. They were raised on his place or shared.

1883 Feb Tues 20 thawed some through the day. Colder this evening. I filed a saw for William holly and one for myself and went up after the mail. WT Ellis DR to cash on store count \$15.00. Paid him for trade today 57¢.

1883 Feb Wens 21 A pleasant winter day. I was helping the women.
1883 Feb Thurs 22 A fine day. Robert and I were up to the corners this fore-n. WT Ellis credit by an overcoat.. Robert Greer to cash for medicine.

1883 Feb Frid 23 thermometer stood at zero this morning. I was out to Coldwater today with George Jeffries. Henry Aenell, Levi Shumrary, and others on a liquor suit against Doc Ayres I rode a horse over to Mr. Logan's left it there and rode with George Jeffers. Got back to Mr. Logan's in the evening.

1883 Feb Sat 24 commence storming about 9:30 this morning, and rained the most of the day. I stayed at Mr. Logan's all night. Came home by the corners to get the mail. Paid Robert Logan cash for sheep too "nippers". If also cash on account. Walter Morrow was here and spent the day.

1883 Feb Sab 25 froze up solid last night. Pleasant but cold today. We did not go to church on account of ice.

1883 Feb Mon 26 A cold chili west wind today with flurries of snow. I was up to see Mrs. Nobles who is very sick this fore-n. Helped W Morrow pile a barn in the afternoon. Angus was over and brought us a card from George saying they would be home this evening. I went to set up with Mrs. Noble this evening. Arthur and I drove over to Montgomery after George's folks tonight but they failed to meet us.

1883 Feb Tues 27 A cold west wind today. Blowed quite hard. I got over to Montgomery after George and Clara this morning but failed to meet them. Was over at 2:00 PM with the same fail. Walter finished his saw between....[Paid] Josh Noble for a little medicine. .95. [neg 24]

1883 Feb Wens 28 A fine day. Thawed considerable. George and Clara got home this morning about 1:00 in the morning. Walter Morrow was here helping me cut wood for filing his saw. Ed Mongus credit by driving up here with George and Clara from Montgomery dollar 50.

1883 Mar Thurs 1 thawed quite fast today. I went up at Mrs. Nobles last night. Drove over to Montgomery after the trunks this morning. Spent the rest of the day with George folks

1883 Mar Frid 2 quite warm today. Robert and I'd rod stalks and wood in the fore-n. Angus folks were here visiting. We spent the afternoon visiting with them. Birds were quite Mary this morning.

1883 Mar Sat 3 quite cold and cloudy with squalls of snow and wind from the

west. Did not fall much. I was out to Fremont with fat sheep and eight grist. Received of Jake Mitchell \$12.35 for three shape weighing 275 pounds at four and I have per pound. 1883 Mar Tues 6 snowed some this fore-n. When Blowed quite hard from the west and colder in the afternoon. Robert was over to Angus's after his single buggy this morning. Angus' was here awhile this fore-n. John Staley took dinner with us.

1883 Mar Wens 7 A cool chilly day Joseph Haight and I went out to northwest center to look at some footer out shape but failed to buy them. Paid Josh nobles store account and four neg \$4.00 35¢.

1883 Mar Thurs 8 thermometer stood at zero this morning. Pleasant but cold through the day. Robert and I were out to by shape but did not find any. Phoebe and M of Jameson came here today.

1883 Mar Frid 9 A fine day. I was up to misses nobles in the morning. Vi and I spent the day at Angus'. Phoebe and am I Jameson went with us. Brought home to bags of oats with me.

1883 Mar 11 A cold blustery day. Vi and I called to see Mrs. Nobles this evening. 1883 Mar Mon 12 a strong west wind the most of the day. I was making A... Drawing stove would etc.. [neg 25]

1883 Mar Tues 13 A fine day. William Haight was helping me cut wood.

1883 Mar Wend 14 A fine day. Thawed quite fast today. Saw a Phibi bird and heard sing. William Haight and I were cutting wood.

1883 Mar Thurs 15 A cold windy day with flurries of snow. Robert and I were up to the corners this morning. I attended A sale at William Mckenneys. George's folks and Vi went over to Walter Morrow with me. Changed a pair of shoes at William T. Ellis is that were got from other. He is Dr to difference 25¢. Paid him for the sugar oil etc. Dollar 45. Paid Edward Mcguiness for bringing George is folks up here tonight February 28 dollar 50.

1883 Mar Frid 16 froze quite hard last night. A cold chili wind through the day. I'drawed wood and William Height fell the big oak I helped in the fore-n. Him and I sawed in PM. We got two chords out of the large oak. William Haight 8821 pound tobacco 50¢.

1883 Mar Sat 17 quite cold this morning. Snow squalls through the night I setup with Mrs. Noble last night. William Haight and I cut wood in the fore-n. He was not here in the afternoon. I filed the saw in the afternoon. Robert went over to his

grandfathers toward evening.

1883 Mar Sab 18 did not freeze any last night. Quite a strong southwest wind in the fore-n. Turn to the north and northeast torts evening and commenced freezing. Vi and I were out to Sab the school and prayer meeting.

1883 Mar Mon 19 there was about 15 inches of snow fell last night and this morning. Fared up about 9:00 AM. Thermometer stood 4° above zero at six this morning. I drawed wood after it fared up. Making 15 cords Drawed.....

1883 Mar Wens 21 thermometer at zero this morning but a fine day. I went over to Angus after oats for Charles Holly this morning. Drawed six loads of wood afterwards. Took mother up to see Mrs. Nobles this evening. Charles Holly DR to two bushel oats borrowed August 29....

1883 Mar Thurs 22 quite cold and cloudy with squalls of snow in the afternoon. And evening we took up a pit of potatoes in the morning. I drawed manure the rest of the day. Gil Woodard helped me in the afternoon. There was 72 bushel of Early Rose in the pit.

1883 Mar Frid 23 rather blustery in the fore-n. Robert and I were **over to** Montgomery. In the fore-n. Arthur and wife rode over with us. I was helping Arthur and afternoon paid Joseph nobles for goods and services a dollar 80. Took Robert to see Dr. Miner today De to cash 25¢. [neg 26]

1883 Mar Sat 24 thermometer stood 4° above zero this morning. Warmed up quite fast and thought considerable in the afternoon. Arthur Woodard and I were out to reading. George Quackenbush road out with us. I was up to halls corners in the afternoon mother Vi and I spent the evening at Arthur's. Paid for several articles at reading \$1.80. Paid M G car right for work done February 22, '40 cents. Received of T. Speier the paper ordered May 18.

1883 Mar Sab 25 A pleasant day. Vi and I were out to Sab school and prayer meeting. The roads were quite flashy coming home this afternoon.

1883 Mar Mon 26 A pleasant day. I was cutting wood and shelling corn Charles Quackenbush was helping me. I was at Arthur's this evening.

1883 Mar Tues 27 quite a cold chili air today. I was helping Arthur Woodard pack up his goods for moving to Sepdlie Jackson Co, his family left on the afternoon train.

1883 Mar Wens 28 quite a chilly air with snow storms in the afternoon. I was helping A. Woodard pack up his goods in the car today. Him and Siln stayed with us last night or rather this morning as we packed goods tell 1:30 AM Stillman started for Jackson over land with team and wagon about 3 1/2 PM. Arthur came home with me to stay overnight.

1883 Mar 29 Thurs A fine day. Thawed some I helped Arthur drive his stock over

and put it in the car he started for Jackson with the car about 4:00 PM he had on seven loads of stuff one load of which was corn in the car one was one yearling calf five hogs 23 sheep 32 chickens and two cats the sites. Robert and I were up to Hall's corners this evening paid WT Ellis for groceries and notions \$2.08.

1883 Mar Frid 30 froze last night Thawed some through the day. We drawed in the last of the corn fodder this fore-n. There was too fair lows of it. Charlie Quackenbush came here this afternoon. He helped me draw my stuff from Arthur's place and I drawed A covered and Bll [yes could be sil] of salt home for him. His father is to pay me or WT Ellis on A L. Woodard account for balance \$9.80

1883 Mar Sat 31 froze last night Thawed today. There was a cold east wind all day. Charles Quackenbush came over and we went to Montgomery this fore-n. Charlie road up home with us. Paid Houg for neck yoke straps and a halter high 65¢ paid Josh nobles for trade this fore-n 55¢.

1883 April 1 Sab A cold chilly east wind. We were not out to church.

1883 April 2 Mon cold this morning. Warmed up through the day. I took Robert up to halls corners to make arrangements for going west. Faded..... Meeting was held at the corners.... Went over to A D Nobles this evening. [neg 27]

1883 April Tues 3 A pleasant day. I took Robert over to Montgomery this morning. Was cleaning up coops, in the greenery shelling corn etc. afterwards. Paid a Guid and company store account to date \$2.05. George Wheaton called here today sold him 38 bushel of potatoes more or less at 50¢ each for Rupsets and 55¢ each for early rows. To be delivered at Stateline A 12 or 13 th of this month.

1883 April Wens 4 quite spring like today rain this PM I drawed a load of hay for Charles Quackenbush in the fore-n. Attended prayer meeting at Angus. Mother stayed at Angus'. Charles Quackenbush dr 2500 pounds of hay belonging to Arthur Woodard. At left for me to sell at \$8.00 per ton. \$2.00. Borrowed of Jonathan C Nobles \$112. I am to have the use of that for 1 year gave my note for the same at .07 percent. He kept \$12.00 of it to rise for a short time.

1883 April Thurs 5 rained quite hard last night and the most of the fore-n. Robert and I were up to the corners in the PM. Paid WT Ellis for sugar and molasses \$1.00.

1883 April Frid 6 pleasant in the fore-n. Squalls of rain and frozen sleet in the afternoon and evening. I started to take Robert and his mother over to Cage Bigfords to make arrangements for going west. Met him at Copeland corners came back to Hugh McMurries and stayed till after dinner stopped at Mrs. Greer for supper.

1883 April Sat 7 some snow on the ground this morning thawed cough today. Robert Vi and I were out to Fremont today. Paid Charles Gilbert all store accounts today 33 dollars and 83¢. Paid Philip Michael balance of oats accounts today \$5.87. Paid Albert Paul for Princes Medimint 5.25. There was six bottles of Med-Dise and three offrills. Vi and Georgie and I sat for a photograph of at dave's today. Are to put them and two pouhes ?[or oauhis but first letter looks like an o] Paid Robert Greer today on work cash \$17.80. I took Robert up home this evening. William Haight DR 21 PK of tobacco got this evening 50¢. Paid WT Ellis for trade this evening 75¢.

1883 April Sat 8 A pleasant day. We were out to Sab school and preaching. Services by Rev. Joseph Mccracken.

1883 April Mon 9 A fine day. We were over to church Rev. Mccracken

moderated a call for Milligan Wiley. Mother came home with us. Paid William Haight balance of work \$2.50.

1883 April 9, 2014 Tues 10 A fine day. I was drawing rails for Charles Quackenbush with team. Willard green commenced working for me by the month yesterday. He has to work for me seven months for the sum of \$75.00. He has been splitting wood for the last two days. Robert's mother Lena and Justin we're here visiting today.

1883 April Wens 11 A fine day. But very high wind last night and this fore-n I was helping William holly take up a bit of potatoes. [neg 28] [neg 29] And Willie helped him take up a pit of potatoes. He is going to take them to Stateline tomorrow morning. There was 10 bushel of mine. I took Robert Greer out to Fremont to start for Kansas. We went out to Newt Woodard's and stayed tell time for midnight train. Newt and I came up to the train with him and I went back home with Newt to stay all night. I took six bushel of wheat and 10 of corn out to mill. Paid Robert Greer the balance due on work \$50.00. Also 01 year interest on note of \$40.00. \$3.20. This knoll was given to his mother. Received of Phillip Michael cash on mistake dollars 75.

1883 April Thurs 12 A fine day. Newt and I were doctoring foot rotten shape for Jake Michael on his farm. And I went home with Newt to stay all night.

1883 April Frid 13 very warm for time of year. We finish doctoring shape for Jake Michael in the fore-n. I came all in the afternoon. Paid duly and Chadwick for sugar 99 cents. Paid Albert hall for tobacco 30¢. Wallace did not work this afternoon sick. Received of J nobles balance two on Newt \$12.80. He paid best to Vi while I was awake. Jacob Michael Der to work done 41.....

1883 April Sab 15 rained through the night and heavy and threatening this morning. Mother and I were out to preaching this fore-n. And Clara Vi and I were out in the evening.

1883 April Mon 16 A fine day. I was up to the corners in the fore-n dragged corn stubble in the afternoon. William holly and I were over to Montgomery this evening. Paid WT Ellis for sugar syrup etc. \$2.43. Paid Sam Jameson for wagon Tongue \$1.00. Wallard went home Saturday evening and came back this afternoon. & went back home in the evening. He is about sick with a hard cold. He is DR 21 I have bushel of potatoes at 50ϕ as 75ϕ . Paid for drugs at the corners and Montgomery 55ϕ .

1883 April Tues 17 A fine day. I was sewing clover seed on the hill lot. And in the orchard. Perrier Stockdale was over and got a load of hay at arthur's barn. There was 10 or 12wt of it. He has to get it weighed at the corners.

Willson Paul and Sarah Vance were married a week ago this evening. [April 10 1883]

1883 April Wens 18 A fine day. Thermometer 76 in the shade at noon. I finished dragging the corn stubble and drawed a load of wood. Harry Stockdale was over and got out another load of Arthur's hay some 900 pounds or over. Charles Quackenbush came here this evening to help Morrow.

1883 April Thurs 19 rained last night cloudy today. I was over to Montgomery this fore-n and Charlie husked snapt corn. We were drawing men or in the PM. I went up to halls corners this evening..... Credit to plank for wagon bottom. [neg 29]

I bought of A P Kellogg a Heick wagon for the summer of \$62.00. Gave my note for the same payable to SJ Heick one year from date with interest at 0.07%.

1883 April Frid 20 rain quite hard last night and froze some before morning. Charlie and I were drawing manure. He went home this evening. John Paul was here accessing this evening. Real estate 2200. Personnel \$250.

1883 April Sat 29 A pleasant day. Quite a strong east wind this evening. I went over to Angus and got 10 bushel of oats this morning. Charlie and I plowed and sewed the shock rows in the fore-n. Finished drawing manure on the garden and plowed part of the afternoon. Charlie took the sow over to Ab Nobles in PM. Charlie went home this evening. Lent him for a short time cash \$10.00.

1883 April Sat 22 A high east wind today and quite cold with rain this morning and squalls through the day. We did not go to church on account of the weather. The Broken horned cow calved this evening Heifer calf 16 days overdue.

1883 April Mon 23 A cool chilly east wind but not so strong as yesterday. I was tagging and trimming sheep in the fore-n. Charlie was here in the afternoon. We finished plowing the garden planted the early potatoes split would etc.. Charles Quackenbush credit by cash returned \$4.00. Note Wens 25 cash

1883 April Mon 23 Willard Green was here and stay all night. Went over to Angus' to commence working for him as I thought he was not able to do mine. I hired Charles Quackenbush to work for me five months at \$18.00 per month to commence May 1.

He was over to Montgomery about half of the afternoon. Paid A P Kellog by Charles for two plow points 95¢ froze quite hard last night.

1883 April Wens 25 pleasant and warm today. I was plowing and sewing out at Angus'. Charlie was at work on the clearing and I went to Montgomery in the fore-n. Was dragging in oats at Angus' in the afternoon. We finished puting and oats this evening. Four acres sold eight bushel.

1883 April Thurs 26 Wallard today with a light fall of rain in the afternoon. I was helping Charlie draw rails for himself. We were hindered half of the afternoon by rain. Charlie did not come home with me. Let William holly cash \$5.00.

1883 April Frid 27 A fine warm day. Charlie and I were plowing, dragging and grubbing for him today. Robert Logan came here this evening. I went home with him.

1883 April Sat 28 A cold chili north east wind. I went over to Southworths with Robert Logan got home at 10:00 this evening. Charlie was drawing would picking up.... On the cleaning. [neg 30]

1883 April Sab 29 A pleasant day. But cool air. We were out to Sab school and preaching services by Rev. Clyde. Charlie came home this evening.

1883 April Mon 30 warmer today. Charlie finished dragging in the new ground for sheep pasture in the morning. Then we commenced grubbing burning and plowing south of Bear swamp. Charlie was not here in the afternoon. I was over to Montgomery this evening. Received of Joseph Noble in trade 49 dozen eggs dollar 40.

Charlie plowed in the afternoon till 4:00 that he went home. Prayer meeting met here this afternoon. I plowed after Charlie went home. Paid William box for pages got September 6 \$1883 \$112.

1883 May Thurs 3 A fine day. A cold north wind this evening. Charlie got here about nine this morning. Brut was helping us grew up on the new ground and spread manure.

1883 May Frid 4 there was quite a heavy rain last night. Cloudy and warm today. Commenced raining about 4 ½ PM there was several heavy showers this evening. Charlie and Brut were cutting seed potatoes and spreading manure and am. Commenced planting in the PM. I fitted potatoe ground and plowed.

1883 May Sat 5 A fine day. We were pulling stumps grubbing and plowing south of the bear swamp. I was up to halls corners this evening paid WT Ellis for trade dollars 75 receive of hairy Stockdale bite WT Ellis \$7.88. For hay and a finish up this page and that go to bed now looks that I sold him for aid J. Woodard. Charles Quackenbush DR 22 bushels of potatoes. William holly credit by cash paid Henry holly \$2.00. Credit by cash received of Charles Quackenbush \$3.00.

1883 May Sab 6 A pleasant day. We were out to Sab school and preaching services by Rev. Clyde of Philadelphia.

He is to pay as soon as sells his corn. I went over and tagged his sheep afterwards. He is DR to the same 58ϕ . Sold Ira Adams a pair sheep. Tre nippers 475. Receive cash 50ϕ balance to 25ϕ .

1883 May Sat 12 A pleasant day. But quite a cold wind off. Charles was not at work today. I went over to Montgomery but the sorrow mere was sick when I got there so I had to come home with her right away. Went after Mr. Goodrich to come and see he thought the trouble was Jarcey. Mr. Chris field called to see her afterwards he thought about the same paid him 50ϕ . I drove up to the corners in the afternoon. Paid Ayers & Son for drugs 15ϕ paid W. Ellis 10ϕ .

1883 May Sab 13 quite a cold east wind today. We were out to Sab school and preaching services by Rev. Clyde. Mother stayed at Angus coming home. Gave Josh Lewis on subscription for supplies \$5.00.

1883 May Mon 14 showery this morning and fore-n with a severe storm of wind and rain and hail tween three and five this afternoon. I was over to Montgomery this fore-n got of William M of Jitson express order to send to A.L. Woodard for 7 dollars and 80¢ including expressage. Sent the same to AL Woodard by mail. Paid Kellog for nails 14 Nobles for cloth 69. Charles helped me in the fore-n and I helped him.....

1883 May Frid 15 quite cool this morning. But a fine day. I was white washing and Charles tinkering in the fore-n. We were ditching on the town ditch for myself in the afternoon. Charles Quackenbush and Vi settled up for all accounts to April 30. Time that he commenced working by the month. Our counts just balanced. Bart Quackenbush DR 2 cash by Charles \$1.00. Angus' brought mother home this morning.

1883 May Wens 16 A fine day. I went out to Fremont with Angus' today. Vi rode over to Angus with me. Charlie was letting water off the corn ground in the fore-n. Ditched on the town ditch in the afternoon. Paid Davis and for pitchers got \$3.00 80¢. Received of Jake Michael's cash for doing sheep \$12.00 I also received of him for Robert Logan \$4.25. Philip Michael credit by set of buggy wheels 10.50. Paid Chadwick Dewey for trade \$3.30 paid P Michael for nails 23¢ P Kluck shrub quick ax. .43. It was reported that there was some 25 or 30 buildings destroyed in the town of Kinderhook in the storm of Monday.

1883 May Thurs 17 A fine day. Charlie was fixing up fence and I was over to Montgomery in the fore-n. We were after sassafras worked for top and ditching in the after ditched about 2 hours. Sold Ed Memgens a load of Arthur Woodard's hay. Received cash on the same \$3.50. He is to have it weighed at Montgomery paid W. Moffitt for a part of salt dollar 20. Took a set of buggy wheels over to State line Hank to make & sat tires. He has to do the job for \$5.00. [neg 32]

1883 May Frid 18 light squalls of rain in the fore-n pleasant in the afternoon. Charlie went away shortly after breakfast and & got home at 3:00 PM. He ditched in the Cornfield the rest of pm. I was at work in the grainery in AM. Plowed for corn in the afternoon.

1883 May Sat 19 there were several heavy showers last night and this morning. Pleasant the rest of the day. Charlie was cleaning the seller ditching corn ground etc.. I went out to Angola to get some medicine of Dr. Weicht for Topsy. Got home at 3 1/2 PM. Stopped at Fremont coming home paid Philip Michael for to tin and wood bills 85¢. Charlie went home about for this evening.

1883 May Sat 20 quite cool today we were out Tues Sab school and preaching services by Rev. Clyde.

1883 May Mon 21 A cold chilly north wind with squalls of snow. The wind blowed quite hard the most of the time. Charlie was not here today. I was at odds and ends. Robert Logan was here this fore-n paid him cash received of J Michael's \$4.25.

1883 May Tues 22 A cold north wind today with squalls of snow and rain. Charlie was not here today came this evening. Took buggy over to Montgomery this morning to have the wheels Hong. Paid E Tachout for a bush seed corn. Received a William Smith for four bushels corn \$8.00 received of R Logan for 200 pounds of A L

Woodard \$4.00.

1883 May Wens 23 A light frost last night. A fine day. Charlie was filling the lie leach shelling seed corn etc.. I took mother up to Mrs. David sheares and went to the corners in the fore-n. Plowed with Gray and Peggy and Charlie ditched in the Cornfield in the afternoon. Received of WT Ellis in trade for 15 1/2 pounds tallow at $16 1/2\phi$ per pound \$1.00.

1883 May Thurs 24 A fine day. I was plowing for corn with three horses. Finished the field south of the orchard. Charlie was pitching in the Cornfield.

1883 May Frid 25 A fine day. Charlie was grubing and burning south of their swamp. I was dragging south of orchard for corn. Charlie Holley marked out corn ground an hour or two for me this evening with his horse.

1883 May Sat 26 rained the most of the fore-n with light squalls of rain in the afternoon. We were at odds and ends in the fore-n. Charlie went home in PM. Charles Quackenbush DR 2 cash 50¢.

1883 May Sab 27 quite cool in cloudy. Mother and I were out to Sab school and prayer meeting there was no preaching.

1883 May Mon 28 rained through the night. Pleasant in the fore-n. Rained the most of the afternoon. Charles Holley marked corn ground for us and we planted in the fore-n. Did not do much in the afternoon on account of rain. [neg 33]

1883 May Tues 29 A fine day. Charlie and I were finishing up a wagon shed. I drove over to Angus' this morning. [top neg 34]

1883 May Wens 30 pleasant in the morning. Commenced raining quite hard about 11:00 AM and rained the most of the afternoon. William and Charles Holly Josh Haight and myself were over to Renyolds washing sheep. Got home about 2:00 PM

1883 May Thurs 31 A fine day. But quite a cold air. I was out after seed corn. Took the women over to Mr. Logan's found some seed corn at John Paul's changed for the same. Spent the rest of the day at Mr. Logan's. Paid Alva Ayers for trade 45 %. Charles Quackenbush went home this morning.

1883 June Frid 1 quite a frost last night. See about 3/16 inch thick on the water trough. I was tagging and trimming Mr. Chestnuts sheep in the fore-n and planted corn in the afternoon. Charles was ditching and planting corn.

1883 June Sat 2 A fine day. We finish planting the field south of the orchard. Mrs. Chestnuts boy helped in the fore-n. We planted potatoes in the field. Three bushel Burbank, two of early rose, one of climax and ½ bushel of snow flake. I drove over to Angus' after his shovel plow in the morning. I took it home. Charlie went home this evening.

1883 June Sab 3 A warm day with enough fragrance of rain this morning but did not until afternoon. And then only a light squalls. We did not go to church.

1883 June Mon 4 A fine day. And quite warm. Charles and I commenced drawing stone this morning south of bear swamp. Angus' sent Georgie over after me. I dragged for him after 9:00 AM and Charles helped him in the afternoon.

1883 June Tues 5 very warm today with quite a heavy shower about 3:00 PM. We were helping Angus until stopped by the rain. Charles and I were up to the corners this evening. WT Ellis credit by goods and groceries \$3.40 DR to five dozen eggs at 14¢ per dozen 70¢.

1883 June Wens 6 very warm this AM commenced raining just the fore-n. There was several light showers in the afternoon. Charlie and I helped Angus' plant in the fore-n. David Logan came here this afternoon. Him and Charles were hunting wood chunks and I was tinkering. He is going to stay all night with us.

1883 June Thurs 7 very warm today. We were drawing stone and stumps south of bears swap in the fore-n. I plowed and Charlie planted corn for Angus in the afternoon. Angus' plowed for me today.

1883 June 8 A fine day. I was plowing for corn. And Charlie planted for Angus'.... Tag for me in the fore-n and Angus' helped me in the afternoon.

1883 June Sat 9 had quite a heavy rain last night. Showery this fore-n. Cloudy this afternoon. Plowed for corn about ½ fore-n and Charlie ground. I plowed again in the afternoon. Angus' helped me plow today. Charlie was not here this afternoon. Cash 4¢. Eight he got credit by ½ bushel seed corn in the evening.

1883 June Sab10 cloudy and threatening rain this morning. Commenced raining at 2:00 PM and rained quite moderate until seven this evening. When we had a tremendous pour down lasting nearly an hour. There was 2 ½ inches of water fell in a pat hale through the storm. Mother and I were out to Sab school and preaching and PM.

1883 June Mon 11 A fine day. Charlie was trimming hedge repairing board fence etc. I was over to Montgomery this fore-n. Went over to Angus after a kettle. Hung a gate etc. in the afternoon. Josh noble credit by a pair of child shoes \$1.25. Charles Schulz credit by pair of slippers for mother 75¢. Paid Aaron Kelly for brooks and staples 15¢. Ed Mangus dr to 1400 pounds or more of hay got at Ade Woodard's barn today at \$7.00 each. \$4.90. Received of him at Montgomery cash \$3.02. The load he got May 17 weighed 820 pounds.

1883 June Tues 12 A dark cloudy day with several very light squalls of rain. We were building calf yard and weighing the hogs in the fore-n. Were at work on corn ground in the afternoon. Angus' dragged in the afternoon. Robert Logan took dinner with us. The oats owl weighed 397. The shoats [blank] 1883 June Wends 13 A fine day. There was a light frost last night. We finished dragging and marking the corn ground this fore-n. Planted four acres of King Phillip corn south of the bear swamp in the afternoon. Angus was helping us with team.

1883 June Thurs 14 A fine day. I took mother over to Angus' in the morning to attend SS convention at Stateline. Charles myself team and wagon were at work on the highway. Josh Haight Pathmaster, Charles and I were up to halls corners this evening. Paid WT Ellis for groceries etc. \$1.20.

1883 June Frid 15 A fine day. Charlie and I myself team and wagon were at work on the highway this fore-n. Finished my roadwork. Charlie was repairing the horse stable and planting corn and I shared cheap at William Peters in the PM. Mother came home this morning.

1883 June Sat 16 A very warm day. Charlie was plowing corn and potatoes and I shared cheap at William Peters. Robert Logan and I are going to share together this year. Mr. Peters paid him for sharing \$6.80. Robert paid me on my share of it back dollar 80. I went over to Montgomery after the buggy this evening. Segindn Strunk credit by work on it \$5.60. Paid Josh noble difference between shoes and brom 45¢.

1883 June Sab 17 pleasant in the fore part of the day with a shower about 8:00

PM. And quite a heavy rain this evening. We were out to Sab school and prayer meeting. Stop at Angus' no... Two 1st rain. [neg 35]

1883 June Mon 18 sunshine and showers and very warm. Charlie was at various things in the fore-n. Plowed corn in the afternoon. Robert Logan and I shared sheep at Ira Adams.

1883 June Tues 19 pleasant and got quite cold this evening. Charlie plowed corn. Robert and I finished Iraq Adams sheep this evening. DR to same \$8.80. We shared eight sheep at Josh Heights this evening after 7:00. Angus was over this evening and got eight bushel seed corn.

1883 June Wens 20 A fine day. Charles was plowing on summer fallow. Robert and I were sharing sheep for Josh Haight. DR 2 same \$4.00.

1883 June Thurs 21 A fine day. Charlie was plowing corn. Robert and I were sharing sheep at Harvey Stockdale's. Received for the same \$4.00.

1883 June Frid 22 a very warm day. Charlie was plowing corn south of the orchard. Robert and I shared cheap ³/₄ day for Charles Runnels at Ira Adams barn DR 2 same \$3.00. Went from there to Dwight Ellis's came home this evening.

1883 June Sat 23 A very warm day Charlie plowed potatoes this fore-n I plowed on new ground in the afternoon. Robert Logan and I finished Dwight Ellis's sheep about 3:00 PM DR to Schering \$4.00. Shared 22 seed for William Holly... This evening at 0.08 per head. DR 2 same.... Cousin Joseph Stewart came here last Wednesday fore-n from Canada.

1883 June Sab 24 quite a heavy rain last night we showers through the day. We were out to Sab school and prayer meeting.

1883 June Mon 25 A dark showery morning. Commenced raining about 10:00 AM and rained more or less the rest of the day. Charles was at odds and ends Robert and I sheared the sheep at D Shavers. Received pay \$4.00. Paid Mrs. Shaver by Mole Shearer \$2.00. Soft heiferauer?

1883 June Tues 26 A dark cloudy day with squalls of rain. Rained quite hard last night. Robert and I shared sheep at Angus' about 8/4 [yes] day. Charlie was not here in PM. Vi came over to Angus' with him and am.

1883 June Wens 27 A dark cloudy day with squalls of rain. Vi and I stayed at Angus' all night. Came home this morning. I went to Montgomery in the fore-n. We were sharing my sheep at Angus' in the afternoon. Angus's and Robert Logan were helping me. Charlie was plowing corn on new ground in the fore-n changed a pair shoes with J noble for goods. Received of Dwight Ellis for sharing \$4.00.

1883 June Thurs 28 rained about all the time today. Charlie done the chores. I went over to Angus and finished sharing my sheep. The 15 old sheep shared an average of 5 pounds plus 14 yearlings shared an average of 6 ½ pounds plus and the bucks weighed 10 pounds 4 ounces. Received of Joseph Haight for sharing \$4.00. [neg 36]

1883 June Frid 29 A fine day. Charlie and I were over to Angus. Cleaned up and divided our oats. There was 37 bushels for me brought them home. At various things the rest of the day.

1883 June Sat 30 A fine day. Charlie was ditching fixing fence etc.. Angus' and I were out to Fremont with our wool received of Deroy & Chadwick \$49.70 for 165 2/3 pounds of wool at 30¢ per pound. Albert Paul credit by four bottles Prince meds \$3.00.

Paid Druey and Chadwick for trade \$3.40. Paid J S Haggerty in interest on a note of \$100 given December 25 1880. \$6.00. On which I paid \$50.00 April 15 1881. This pays the interest up to January 16 83. Charles Quackenbush DR 2 cash \$1.00.

1883 July Sab 1 pleasant but quite cool. We were not out to church on account of nursing a boil on my face.

1883 July Mon 2 A very warm day. Charlie was plowing corn. Robert and I were shearing at Charles Adams. Received payment for the same \$2.00. Paid Robert Logan his share of Dwight Ellis, Josh Haights and Charles Adams \$7.00.

1883 July Tues 3 A very warm day. Charlie was plowing corn. Robert and I shared at W Morrows about 3/4 day. He is DR 2 same \$2.00. Shared at Mrs. Chestnuts the rest of the day. Charlie went home this evening. Received of Ira Adams Adams for sharing 8.80 Robert and I have divided all cash received for sharing so far.

1883 July Wens 4 thermometer stood at 96 at 5:00 PM. Charlie was not here this fore-n. Plowed corn between showers this afternoon. Robert and I finished Mrs. Chestnuts sheep about $10 \frac{1}{2}$ this fore-n. Received for the same \$3.20. Shared at D Mitchell's the rest of the day.

1883 July Thurs 5 quite cool this fore-n. Very warm this afternoon with a shower and 1:00 PM. Charlie was plowing corn. Robert and I finished shearing at D Mitchell's in the fore-n DR 2 same \$4.00. Shared that just chestnuts in the afternoon. Received of Charles Runnels for corn of Arthur Woodard's \$9.00. Also on sharing done June 22 dollar 80.

1883 July Frid 6 very warm through the day with a shower this evening. And cooler. Charlie was plowing corn and potatoes. Robert and I finished shearing at just chestnuts about 10:00. He is DR to the same \$3.00. Shared at Rev. Altman's until about 4:00 PM. He is Der to the same dollars 75. Robert went home this evening.

1883 July Sat 7 cloudy and cool with light showers in the fore-n. Got quite cold with the wind from north east torts evening. Charles was plowing corn cutting geap [yes] tinkering etc.. Robert and I shared sheep for Charles holly finished 4 ½ PM, DR 2 same \$3.25. We drove over to Montgomery this evening. Charles Quackenbush DR to cash \$5.00. Paid Lehman Strunk on repairs on buggy \$5.00. Robert Logan DR to a pair of sheet shares and cash \$1.50. This balances all accounts between us to date. Phillip Michael credit buy shares got by Robert dollar 40. Divided all money received by Robert and I between us up to this time. [neg 37]

1883 July Sab 8 A cool but pleasant day. We were out to Sab school and preaching services by Rev. William Fulton.

1883 July on 9 A cool but pleasant day. Charlie was plowing corn. Angus cut about five acres of geap form eight at William holly's. Robert and I shared sheep for Joshua wood Dobbs. Paid for cakes and sow at Montgomery 60¢. I went over to Mrs. Chestnuts after sow and five pigs. Paid for the same \$16.00.

1883 July Tues 10 A fine day. Charlie plowed corn for Angus and I. Robert and I shared sheep for john Dobbs in the fore-n. DR to me for sharing \$3.00. S Rupel shared with us yesterday and this fore-n. We left the rest for him to finish. We were putting rye up hour hay at William holly's this afternoon. Russell Jameson was helping us for Angus' and Sam yield chestnut helped us about 2 hours. Paid Josh nobles for coffee and tobacco 42¢.

1883 July Wens 11 A fine day. We were drawing the hay cut on William Holly's. I had six lows for my share Angus's and hand were helping us at Mr. Chestnut helped us in the AM.

1883 July Thurs 12 A fine shower this morning. Fared up about 10:00 AM. Charlie raked up the metal at Holly's and I went over to wake of lands mail in the afternoon. Took 11 bushel corn and six bushel of wheat, wet by the corners paid WT Ellis cash on store count \$10.00. Paid Samuel chestnut for trade 68¢.

1883 July Frid 13 quite a heavy shower last night cloudy this morning. But a fine day. Charlie plowed potatoes and I mowed for Angus' in the fore-n. We were drawing their ratings and grap cut at William holly's in the afternoon. I sold my share of them to Charles Quackenbush DR DR to the same \$9.00 [could be 1.00 as his 1s look like 9s due to lousy pen]

1883 July Sat 14 A fine day. Quite warm. Charlie plowed corn in the fore-n. I helped Angus' draw hey in the afternoon. I raked up hey for Angus' in the fore-n and helped drawing in PM.

1883 July Sab 15 A heavy rain last night pleasant today. We were out to Sab school and preaching services by Rev. William Fulton. We're out in the evening.

1883 July Mon 16 A warm day with a strong southwest wind the most of the day. I mowed for Angus about ¾ of day and Charlie plowed corn and potatoes. Angus and I loaded up the reaper brought it over and set it up for harvesting. Received of Mr. Aultman's by Angus's wife for sg 1.75.

1883 July Tues 17 A cool cloudy day with quite a strong south west and west wind. Vi and I were up to see Mrs. Greer this morning. Angus was over and help desk cut rye till about 10:00 AM. When he went home to attend to hay. Charlie and I were binding rye and cuting wheat in the fore-n. Helped Angus draw hey in the PM. Paid A G Judson for trade dollar 10. Paid Hoag for pad and work on horse collar 75¢ paid Mrs. David Shere by daughter all of on days Makz. 40¢. [neg 38]

1883 July Wens 18 A fine day. Quite cool. We were harvesting. Angus was helping us. Arthur Woodard wife & boy came here from Jackson today morning. Arthur help this harvest in PM. Rev. William Fulton and wife spent the afternoon here. Angus' family spent the day here.

1883 July Thurs 19 A fine harvest day. We were harvesting. Angus' and Arthur were helping us. Charles Arthur and I were up to halls corners this evening. WT Ellis credit by 20 pounds sugar at 10¢ \$2.00 paid him for crackers coffee etc. \$1.00 11. Paid Arthur Woodard cash on sales \$20.00.

1883 July Frid 20 warm and cloudy with a light fall of rain in the fore-n. That hindered us about 2 hours. Angus was cutting wheat for Arthur Woodard and I was helping him and Charlie finished setting up at home that helped Arthur about ¼ of day.

1883 July Sat 21 A wet fore-n pleasant this afternoon. We were grinding reaper sickles etc. In the AM. Was cutting wheat for A. Woodard in the afternoon. Charlie was setting up wheat and rye in the afternoon. Bart Quackenbush helped us part of the afternoon. Paid him for the same 25¢

1883 July Sab 22 A very warm day with quite a strong southwest wind. We were out to preaching this evening services by Rev. William Fulton.

1883 July Mon 23 A cloudy morning and quite warm commenced raining about

3:00 PM. There was a heavy fall of rain. Charlie Quackenbush Ben Wallace Judson helped Arthur in the fore-n and the helped Angus' in the afternoon George Quackenbush and I reset my Southfield of wheat and helped Angus's the rest of the time. Angus' finished cutting for Arthur and moved home and commenced cutting for himself.

1883 July Tues 24 rained the most of the time this fore-n. Pleasant in the afternoon. We were repairing the cradle grinding mower sickles etc. in the fore-n. Was up to halls corners in the afternoon. Brought home two loads of gravel for horse stable with us. Borrowed of Ben Stockdale for 1 year \$50.00. Have a note for the same varying 0.08 interest. Took up a note given 2 June Greer for 40 dollars November 23, 1880 with interest on the same \$2.10. Paid Ben Stockdale account to date 90¢. WT Ellis credit for 20 pounds of sugar \$2.00 paid him for various articles 75¢ received of Charles Holly on sharing \$3.80.

1883 July Wens 25 A fine day. We fixed up the wheat stocks in the morning. Helped Angus's harvest today. Arthur Charlie and myself were helping him. Had to cut a good deal of it with the cradle on account of the ground being so level.

1883 July Thurs 26 very warm today. Arthur and Charlie junior Defiew and myself were helping Angus harvest. We had to use the cradle a good deal on account of the ground being so level paid may call for meat Saturday 75¢. [neg 39]

1883 July Frid 27 A fine day. There was a very light shower here about 3:00 PM. Rained at Angus' so that they could not draw wheat. Charlie and Arthur Jo and I helped Angus's finish cutting his wheat in the fore-n. Joseph and I came home and cut rye after dinner. The boys came here from Angus' about 4:00. Angus' and hand came with them to help us. John Andy and Walter Morrow were here and took supper with us.

1883 July Sat 28 A fine day. Joseph Depew and I were drawing and stacking wheat. Charlie and Arthur were helping Angus's draw wheat till 5:00. Helped us the rest of the evening. We went up till halls corners this evening. Paid Joseph Depew on harvesting \$5.00. Charles Quackenbush DR to cash \$3.00.

1883 July Sab 29 A fine day. But quite cool we were out to Sab school and prayer meeting. Attending preaching at the hall G & H [might be State line] in the evening. Andy Morrow came home with us to stay all night.

1883 July on 30 quite cool but a fine day. Arthur Charlie and I helped Angus' draw wheat3/4 of the day. Charlie plowed corn and Arthur and I cut rye. Were up to the corners in the evening. Paid WT Ellis for novelty 40¢ Ayrs and son credit buy a box of kidney water 90¢ the women were up to the corners this PM. WT Ellis credit by trade done by them \$3.35.

1883 July Frid 31 A fine day. We were mowing cutting rye, raking and cocking hay etc.. Arthur and Angus' helped us all day. I and Rupel Jameson for Angus' in the afternoon. Arthur took the B eighth Cow over to D Thomas in am.

1883 Aug Wend 1 A fine day. We were drawing and stacking. Arthur Woodard sweat. Finished about 5:00 PM. Drawed and stacked six loads of hay for myself this evening. John and Andy Morrow came here today. They help this this evening.

1883 Aug Thurs 2 A fine day. Got quite cool towards night. We were drawing and stacking the balance of our hay wheat and rye. We had 14 loads of hay. 12 loads of wheat and eight of rye all together. Besides hay that I cut at William holly's. John and Andy Morrow, Angus' and Mr. Jameson and Arthur Woodard were helping us today.

Sent Johnson nobles for a few days the dollar 55.

1883 Aug Frid 3 A fine day. But quite cool. Charlie was plowing corn I was visiting with john and Andy in the fore-n. They went over to Walters after dinner and I went over to Montgomery in the PM. Paid Aaron Kellog for a double shovel 70¢ received of Joshua wood Dobbs balance due Robert and I on sharing \$5.25.

1883 Aug Sat 4 A pleasant day. But quite cold. Charlie went over to Thomas rentals after a sow taken their five weeks ago. Plowed corn the rest of the day. I was out to Fremont to mail. 1883 Oct Tues 16 pleasant but a cold east wind. We were mixing and carrying mortar. Herbie lords was here plastering. Finished the chamber.

1883 Oct Wens 17 A fine day. We were mixing and carrying mortar. Hubert Lords was plastering.

1883 Oct Thurs 18 rained the most of the time today. We were mixing and carrying mortar. H lords was plastering. Finished plastering today.

1883 Oct Frid 19 A heavy rain this morning faired up about 9:00 AM. H lords went home because it was too wet to build chimney. We were cleaning and picking up things this fore-n. Charlie cut corn and went over to Montgomery in the afternoon. Came home by Angus's and helped him ... A sheep. Paid Josh nobles for Grock dollar

20thery Greer went home this afternoon. [neg 49]

1883 Oct Sat 20 A cold cloudy day, with a chilly north east wind. We were making mortar Husking corn picking up around the yard tending Mason etc.. Charles went home this evening. Mary Greer got back this evening. Brought her Beaux with her. Hube lord's was here floating [yep that is what is written] the plastering about an hour this fore-n. Done some patching for Josh Haight and worked about 4 hours this afternoon. Josh Haight DR 23 bushels mortar at 25 cents each 75¢

1883 Oct Sat 21 cold and cloudy with flurries of snow this morning we were out to Sab school and preaching services by Rev Reed of our church

1883 Oct Mon 22 cool and cloudy Charlie and I were making cow polks [yes] Husking corn and digging potatoes.

1883 Oct Frid 23 quite a cold air and cloudy today. We finished digging our potatoes Josh Haight was helping us to pue [or jue] for helping him shingle his house. We had about 64 bushel of potatoes all told. Received of Josh Haight for mortar got sat 75¢.

1883 Oct Wens 24 A dark cloudy day with light squalls of rain in the fore-n. We sorted and put in the seller 20 bushels eating potatoes. Three bushels extra seed potatoes and a bushel small potatoes. I drawed up and fitted 38 bushel Bearbank and Rose.

1883 Oct Thurs 25 A dark cloudy morning commenced raining between eight and 9:00 AM and rained nearly all the rest of the day.

1883 Oct Thurs 25 [new page] Charlie was ditching for himself and I gathered wok [yes] tells stopped by the rain. Charlie went home and I tinkered in PM. Charles Quackenbush and I looked over accounts this fore-n. Settled all accounts up 2 October 11 may be making five months time that he had worked for me at \$18.00 per month. I owe him a balance of \$66.00 and 50¢ up to that time.

1883 Oct Frid 26 rained the most of the night but pleasant today. Charlie husked corn split wood in the fore-n. Ditched for himself in the afternoon. I was out to Fremont. David Michael credit by two bales water [yes] Lmke 3.50 & ma BR stone lime 1.10. 4.68. Paid Philip Michael 43 and ½ length pipe \$1.00 and elbow paid Chadwick and Dewey for dry goods and grove dollar 65.

1883 Oct Sat 27 quite heavy frost last night cloudy today with several spurts of rain. We were running off line lime Husking corn lifting sand etc..

1883 Oct Sab 28 A dark cloudy day with showers and squalls of rain. We did not go to church on account of weather.

1883 Oct Mon 29 rained the most of the night. Pleasant the most of the day. Quite a shower at noon. Charlie was cutting wood and cleaning yard and I was over to Montgomery in fore-n. We were setting up stove Husking corn etc. In the afternoon. Angus' brought me a load of apples. He is credit by 22 bushel at 60¢. \$13.20. Paid Josh nobles for groceries eight and meds. \$2.80. Brought home a load of goods... [from] the depot for George. Paid freight on it \$5.43. [neg 50]

1883 Oct Tues 30 A pleasant day. But quite a strong west wind part of the time. We were cutting and drawing would Husking corn etc.. Wallace Judson was here and got 12 bushel rye for his father. H G Judson DR to 12 bushel rye at 75¢ each. \$9.00.

1883 Oct Wens 31 A very strong west wind and quite cold. Charlie was splitting wood taking the jlon [could be flon] out of the hog pen and cleaning it out etc.. I went

over to Clear Lake after sand in the fore-n. And up to DePew Bro after planks for Hog pen Jlon in PM [maybe it is plan for planks] Depew Bro cr by 288 plank at \$11.00. \$3.17. Paid WT Ellis for trade 75¢. [neg 51]

1883 Nov Thurs 1 A cold cloudy disagreeable day. We were putting flon in the Hog pen Husking corn etc.. Charlie was up home this fore-n. Sold him 10 lambs at \$2.00 per head DE to the same \$20.00. 1883 Nov Frid 2 pleasant but cold. Angus' and I took the cider apples over to Montgomery but failed to get them ground. Paid Many Strunk for harnessing jag. 40¢. George's folks came in on the 2:00 PM train.

1883 Nov Sat 3 A dark cloudy day. Charlie was Husking corn etc.. I was over to the cider mail this in the fore-n, but failed to get the cider. We butchered eight paid and drawed corn in the PM. A cool George Selfridge came here this afternoon from Illinois'. William holly DR 2 \$2.31. I sent this to Hillsdale with him to get me some wire screen for door.

1883 Nov Sab 4 A pleasant day. We were out to Sab school and prayer meeting. 1883 Nov Mon 5 cloudy in the fore-n. Commenced raining in the afternoon. We were at several things in the morning. Hubie Lords came here to commence putting on the putty coat, got here about 10:00 AM. Charlie went up home after a load of wood for me credit by \$1.00. Received a William holly the green wire and bath of cash. The wire cost 90¢ balance of cash out \$2.40. \$3.30.

1883 Nov Tues 6 rained quite hard last night. Pleasant today. Charlie was Husking corn and I attended Mason in the fore-n. In the afternoon Charlie attended Mason and I went over to Montgomery. Paid Dr. Merry for childs chair got September 15 90¢ paid Kellogg for Glafs tax brushes etc. 1.01 paid Maroney and company for sugar and oil 98¢. George Null dr to 400 brick at 16¢.

1883 Nov Wens 7 quite a heavy frost last night and quite cold today. Charlie was cutting grafs [or grap]at Angus' and was tending Mason in the fore-n. I finished cleaning up wood yard in PM. Herbie Lord's plastered here in the fore-n. Went down to George Nulls in the afternoon.

1883 Nov Thurs 8 A fine day. Charlie cut grap at Angus' in the fore-n. Raked it up in the afternoon. I was helping clean up the house filling emigs kegs etc. Uncle George and mother went over to Angus. George knoll de 265 cases of lath 20ϕ . Angus' bought the cider home today. Paid him for making 50. He is credit by \$2.50..... The cider apples at 25ϕ per bushel. [neg 51]

1883 Nov Frid 9 reign very hard last night showery this fore-n. Pleasant in the afternoon. Charlie was Husking corn I was setting glafs [yes] putting screen on cupboard dans painting etc.

1883 Nov Sat 10 threatened rain in the fore-n. Pleasant in the afternoon. I was painting etc.. Charlie and William holly were Husking corn in the fore-n. I helped Charlie ditch on the town ditch in the afternoon. Angus folks brought Uncle George and mother home this evening.

1883 Nov Sab 11 A pleasant day. But got quite windy this evening. We were out to Sab school and prayer meeting.

1883 Nov Mon 12 froze quite hard last night with squalls of snow. A cold windy cloudy day. Charlie was out at work on his ditch. I helped him ditch half a day.

1883 Nov Frid 13 A cold windy day froze some last night. We were at work on

my ditch in the fore-n. Husked corn in the PM. Charles holly credit by a 19 pounds spare rib.

1883 Nov Wens 14 A cold windy blustery day. Thermometer stood at 20 this morning. Charlie and I were drawing hay from Angus'. Drawed a load apiece for Angus'. Charlie and myself. Angus' and Justin were here this evening.

1883 Nov Thurs 15 A cold windy day with heavy squalls of snow. Thermometer stood at 18 this morning. We finished drawing hay this fore-n. Charles went home this afternoon. DR to cash today [page torn can read]

1883 Nov Frid 16 pleasant but quite cold. Thermometer 14°this morning. We were Husking corn. Charlie took some mail over to Montgomery for George this afternoon.

1883 Nov Sat 17 wind nearly south and quite pleasant. Charles was recovering potatoes that's etc.. George and Clara Vi and I were out to reading after furniture etc.. I paid for various things at several places \$2.68.

1883 Nov Sab 18 A pleasant day. We were out to Sab school and prayer meeting.

1883 Nov Mon 19 A fine day. Charlie was Husking corn. I took the sheep over to Angus' and changed them in the fore-n. Husked corn in the afternoon. I went over to George Null's in the evening. Received of him brick got November 6 \$2.00. I also received of him to buy a brick for him at Angola when I go after my own \$5.00

1883 Nov Frid 20 rained the most of the time today. We were at odds and ends. Walter and Hattie were here today.

1883 Nov Wens 21 reign very hard this morning fared up till about 4:00 PM when it commenced raining again. We were at various things in the fore-n. Charlie went home and I went over to Wakemans to mill in the afternoon. Took 18 bushel of wheat one rye for feed and six bushel wheat for flower. Brought home seven bags feed and seven of flower left three bags feed and two of flower. Mother and Uncle George went as far as Mr. Logan's with me. Mother is going to stay all night. Paid for groceries, oil etc. at the mill dollar 70. [neg 52]

1883 Nov Thurs 22 A cloudy day but did not storm. Charlie was Husking corn. I went out to Angola after brick for George Null and myself. Paid Erve Bro for1000 brick \$8.80. I got home about 3 ½ PM. I went over to Mr. Logan's after mother. Brought home a buck lamb bought of Robert last summer.

1883 Nov Frid 23 cloudy and cool. Charlie was Husking corn I went over to Montgomery after the brick shipped from Angola yesterday paid for shipping \$2.80. I got 500 and left 500 for George and Null. He owes me a balance on brick and shipping of 78¢. We drawed a load of corn and fixed a pen and rack for the brick in the PM.

1883 Nov Sat 24 A fine day. We were Husking and drawing corn. Charles went this evening.

1883 Nov Sab 25 A pleasant day. We were out to Sab school and prayer meeting.

1883 Nov Mon 26 rain quite hard last night. And this morning. Fared up towards noon. Charles went home after a load of wood this afternoon. He is credit by the same \$1.00. Hubi Llord's was plastering this afternoon and I tended him.

1883 Nov Frid 27 froze quite hard last night thawed some today. Charles husked corn and I attended Mason. Hubi got here at 8 ½ o'clock this AM.

1883 Nov Wens 25 froze some last night. A fine day. Charlie drawed corn I

cleaned wheat in the fore-n. He went to mill to get a grist for himself and me in the afternoon Hubi lord finished plastering and building chimney today. I was tending him. Paid Erve McNall the butcher \$2.30 balance due on meat account to this date. Hubert Lords dr to 4 bushel wheat \$1.00 0. 4.00 Charlie took it to mail for him this PM.

1883 Nov Thurs 29 A pleasant day. But quite a breeze from the southwest. National Synododical thanksgiving. We attended prayer meeting. Charles went home this morning.

1883 Nov Frid 30 cool and cloudy uncle in eye were Husking corn. Tinkered etc.. Angus' and Justin came over this afternoon Angus' helped uncle husk and I went with Justin over to his grandfathers after some sheep but failed to get them. Borrowed of Uncle George for a few days \$20.00. Sold Charles Heues one white sow and three "shoats". At \$3.80 per "crot" [yes] straight. Received on the same \$5.00. [we have not figured out why he calls goats shoats and now we see crot]

1883 Dec Sat 1 A pleasant day. I took the women over to state line to see Mrs. Alex Jameson. Took whole be Llord's grist over to him. Paid him back on plastering \$10.00. Paid B M McSouth interest of \$8.00 on a note of \$100 given November 16, 1882. Paid Ren Fulton on carpet 68¢. [neg 53]

1883 Dec Sab 2 quite a cold chili west wind. We were out to Sab school in preaching services by Rev. PM Wiley.

1883 Dec Mon 3 A pleasant day. But quite cool. We took the hogs over to Montgomery. Received of Charles Heues for 970 pounds pork \$5.85 crot (Including cash when sold) \$37.35. Paid Josh nobles for coffee, tea pills etc. \$1.36. Paid Micael for sugar \$1.00. He is credit by parlor stove \$12.00 Paid Linne Steul blacksmith bill \$1.10.

1883 Dec Frid 4 A pleasant day. Vi & I were up to the corners this fore-n. We butchered A shoat this afternoon. Edward and Phoebe Morrow came here this evening. Paid Uncle George cash borrowed November 30, '20 dollars. Paid WT Ellis for under eve carpet etc. \$6.65. Paid Joseph hall balance on horse collar for Angus' \$1.00.

1883 Dec Wens 5 A fine day. Edward and I went out south of Grampton to see Mr. Taylor on business of Edwards uncle went over to Wakemans after my grist.

1883 Dec Thurs 6 A fine day. Edwards folks, Vi and I spent the day at W Morrow left Edwards folks there I drove over to Montgomery paid Charles Schultz expansion boot \$1.15 Uncle drawed up wood and corn. Charles Quackenbush and hand cut wood for me about half a day. Sold Jake Huntington the broken horned Cow for \$16.00. I am to send her to Fremont next balance received cash \$2.00.

1883 Dec Frid 7 A showery day. Rained some last night and some through the day. Communion fast day. We attended preaching services by Rev. P H Wiley and Rev. Mccracken.

1883 Dec. Sat 8 cloudy and cold. We attended preaching. I was over to Montgomery this evening. Justin Greer took her out to Fremont for me. Received the balance due me. Paid him 90¢. Paid Charles Schultz for shoes for Georgie dollars 30. Paid Josh Nobles for medicine and oil \$1.35. Paid expressage on a box of books for boys and Clara. \$2.20.

1883 Dec Sab 9 A fine day. But quite cool. We attended church had communion today. Rev. P H Wiley and Joseph Mccracken held services. Uncle George and mother

stayed at Walters last night and are going to stay with them tonight. George and I attended preaching at Hall's corners this evening. Services by Rev. Mccracken.

1883 Dec Mon 10 A fine day. We attended preaching in the fore-n. Walters folks Vi and I spent the afternoon at G L French is. Mother and uncle spent the afternoon at Angus'.

1883 Dec Wens 12 A fine day. Uncle was picking and drawing stone for me from Samuel Sherrers. I was at work on the town ditch. Mother and Vi were up to D Shruas and Josh Paul's this fore-n.

1883 Dec Thurs 13 A fine day. Cloudy and PM commenced raining this evening. Uncle drawed stone. I was ditching on town ditch. Joseph Haight was helping me.

1883 Dec Frid 14 cold and cloudy with squalls of snow. I was at work on the town ditch. Charles Quackenbush helped me. He is going to stay all night. [neg 54]

1883 Dec Sat 15 quite cold and blustery today. Freezing all day. I was working on the town ditch. Charles Quackenbush helped me in the fore-n. And Joseph Haight in the afternoon. This makes Josh and I square on work account. Charles Quackenbush credit by one cord of wood delivered \$1.80. He had my team to draw this PM. He is to be credit by cash for a short time \$15.00.

1883 Dec Sab 16 A cold cloudy day. With a fine snow the most of the day. I was out to Sab school and prayer meeting on foot.

1883 Dec Mon 17 quite cold today with flurries of snow. I was over to Montgomery in the fore-n. Charles Quackenbush was here and got his lambs this afternoon. I sold him four sheep at \$2.00 per head \$8.00. Resettled up accounts to this date. I owe him on work and other deal including cash borrowed the 15th \$75.00.

1883 Dec Tues 18 cold and cloudy I was up to halls corners this fore-n. Angus folks were here and spent the day. Paid WT Ellis for trade today \$1.60. Paid A G. Judson for sugar and cheese \$1.00. Paid Joseph Depew on Saul bill \$1.00.

1883 Dec Wens 19 pleasant but quite cold I was over to Montgomery in the foren. Helped the folks in the house in the afternoon. Paid nobles for trade 86¢. Paid Charles Schultz for repair mother shoes he is credit by a pair of rubber boots dollar 50. Paid Weaver for 5 rolls wallpaper \$1.06 Charles Quackenbush DR to use of team and over john to draw potatoes?

1883 Dec Thurs 20 quite a cold chilly south wind. I was out to Fremont today. Albert Paul credit by wallpaper, fish, mittens, etc. \$3.35. Paid Dewey and Chadwick for trade \$1.25 paid David Michael for lime got December 28 dollar 10. And for notions got at several places 75¢.

1883 Dec Frid 21 quite a cold blustery day. I was helping the women clean paint and white wash the house.

1883 Dec Sat 22 A cold cloudy day. Snowed two or 3 hours this afternoon. I was out to Fremont. Angus went out with me. Paid Philip Michael for trade 40¢ Albert Paul credit by trade to date 74¢. I left with him five of Clara's books to sell. He is DR to the same at dollar 28. \$6.48 received of Dr. Haggerty and Phillip Michael for books \$4.00. Paid over the same to George and Clara \$4.00.

1883 Dec Sab 23 A dark cloudy day with storms of snow and rain or sleet. We

did not go to church on account of storm.

1883 Dec Mon 24 cloudy and quite cold. I was over to Montgomery this morning I took Mary up home this afternoon. Dr. Merry credit by a cottage beds did \$2.00. Paid M D Soloin land personal and insurance tax \$21.03. \$3.64 of this was insurance tax. Received of George Null balance on brick and lath 98¢ this is not include the balance on soft brick.

1883 Dec Tues 25 cold and cloudy. Angus folks were here holding Christmas. I went after Mary this evening. Paid Justin Greer by Mary cash sent by Angus \$1.00. [neg 55]

1883 Dec Wens 26 A fine day. We butchered a couple of hogs. Angus' helped us. 1883 Dec Thurs 27 quite cold and blustery in the fore-n. And pleasant in the afternoon. I was helping Angus Klein a few bushel wheat. And the missing four books. Got dinner at David Mitchell's.

1884 Jan Sat 26 A fine day Uncle & the boys were up to the Corners & I filed and fitted the saw in the fore-n Cut wood in the afternoon Jas Haight helped W.T. Ellis cr by coffee, tea & oil .85

1885 Apr Tues 14 A cold chilly winter day We took up a pit of potatoes in the fore-n ?? [attended] Abe Aultmans sale in PM [can't read bottom as page ragged torn. neg 93 end of this book]
