Two Girls Injured

RYAN ROAD — Considerable mystery surrounded the details of the finding of a car early Saturday morning in the county drain that crosses the Ryan road two hundred feet south of the Nine Mile road.

An investigation made by Deputy Don Case disclosed the fact that the car belonged to Ruth Horn, age 23, of 3242 Lothrop street, Detroit.

The car had apparently crashed through a rail at a terrific speed and was standing on end when found at 7 a. m. A passing motorist brought word of the accident to Deputies Van Hulle and Van Egmond who immediately started an investigation of their own.

It was later found that Miss Horn had been taken to St. Francis hospital in Hamtramck in a semi-unconscious condition and seriously injured. A companion of Miss Horn's, Mary

Wanger, 23, of 67 Moss avenue, Highland Park, had been taken home and suffered from bad cuts and bruises, also a broken nose. The girls were both employees of the Burroughs Adding Machine Company in Detroit.

Relations of Miss Horn couldn't explain the appearance of the girls in Macomb county and stated they usually went out together but were most always home by midnight.

The condition of the car indicated that possibly some drinking may have taken place. An empty bottle was still in it and a report stated that there was a strong odor present that smelled strongly of chloroform.

A thorough investigation is under way by thes heriff's department and it is the belief that a third party was also present.
