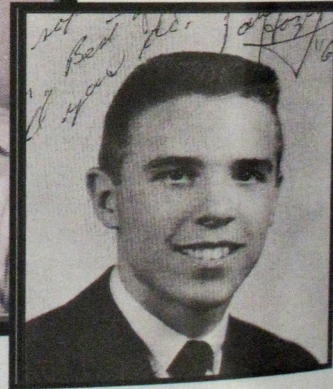

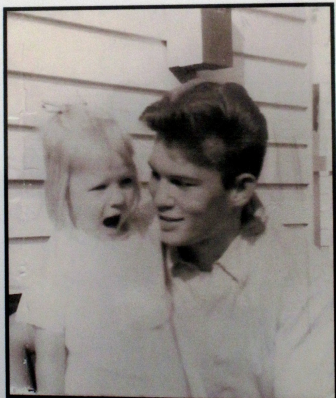

Center Line GI Dies in Vietnam

CENTER LINE -- The death of Sgt. Daniel Francis Cahill, 21, in Vietnam Monday left his family, friends and former teachers stunned, real bitterness of war.
 The eldest of Mr. and Mrs. Basil F. Cahill's seven children, Daniel graduated from St. Clement High School, attended Macomb County Community College for one year and entered the service in January 1963.
 He had been in Vietnam three months when he died "from wounds received on combat operations when engaged with a hostile force in a fire fight."
 SGT. Cahill was vice-president of his senior class, active in school theatre groups and the Future Teachers' Club.
 "I think he had a very special talent for writing poetry," Sister said, "a depth of soul that didn't ordinarily come out if you talked to him only casually."
 Sgt. Cahill had just turned 21 in November. His family lives at 7251 Weingartz, Center Line. Funeral arrangements will be handled by Ford Funeral Home.

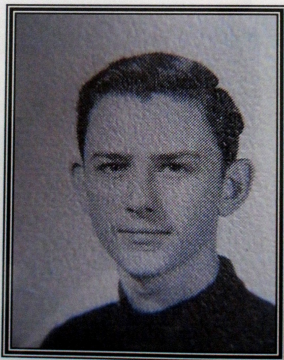

Warren Soldier Dies in Vietnam

WARREN -- A war on the other side of the globe has become a grim reality to Mr. and Mrs. Albert J. Carrier, Jr.
 The Vietnam War has claimed the life of their 19-year-old son.
 SP4 Albert J. Carrier, III was killed while on a combat mission Friday.
 The young Albert, a former student at Cousino High School, enlisted in the U.S. Army in May of 1968 and arrived in Vietnam May 18, 1969.
 Serving in the 5th Battalion, 12th Infantry, "He enlisted because he wanted to." His grieving mother said.
 She added, "We are not bitter about the war. He wouldn't want us to be."
 An Army spokesman said Carriers' body would arrive some time after Labor Day and could be viewed at the Rudy Funeral Home, 25850 Van Dyke, Center Line, with burial scheduled at Resurrection Cemetery, Clinton Township.
 The Carrier's are an active family in the community. The grandfather was one of the original Warren Township police officers who in 1967 retired as sergeant.
 Carriers' grandmother was a longtime member of the Van Dyke School Board.
 Carrier is also survived by his sister, Mrs. Alice Keens, 21, and brothers Harold, 15, and Alan, 13.

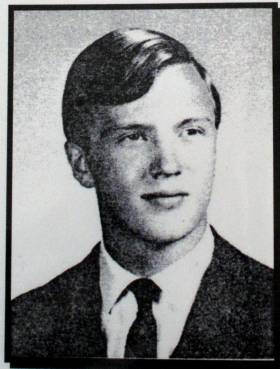

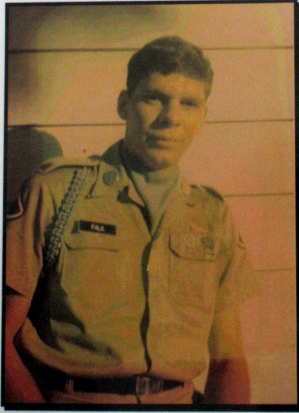

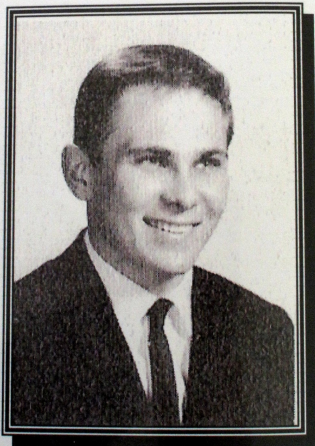

GI Dies In Vietnam

WARREN - Sgt. Stanley F. Farro, a 1967 Warren Woods High School graduate who has been in Vietnam less than a month, drowned while on his fourth combat mission, the Army has informed his parents.

Although details were not immediately available, the family was told the death occurred in the Mekong Delta while the soldier was serving with the 9th Division.

"I really don't know what to say," said Ernest Farro, father of the 20 year-old sergeant, "the only information we have received is that our son was drowned while on a combat mission."

Sergeant Farro was drafted March 4, 1968, and arrived in Vietnam Jan. 16, 1969. Date of death, according to the message from the Army headquarters, was Feb. 7.

A member of Warren Woods first football team in 1966, Farro, after graduation, was employed by the Chrysler Stamping Plant at Sterling. He also was taking evening engineering course in East Detroit.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Farro Sr., 29453 Malvina, he has a brother, Ernest Jr., 18, a senior at Warren Woods High School and a sister, Susan, 12.
