



HISTORY OF VILLAGE OF WARREN FIRE DEPARTMENT

Village of Warren is one of the oldest Communities in Macomb County. First known as Beebe's Corners but since incorporated as a Village in 1893 it has been known as the Village of Warren.

One of this thriving village's most important organizations is its fire department, which has been fighting fires in the village and surrounding territory since its organization April 4, 1926. The fire department is the oldest organization in Warren Township. George Shoop is now chief of the fire department.

Seven of its present members were listed on the charter roll of the department and have served continuously ever since. They include the following members: Leo Roth, N. D. Eckstein, Floyd Rickabush, Peter Trombly, Ernie Steffens, Ray Lutz and Merton Lyons. Other members of the department at present are Harold Squier, John Taylor, Don Cockerline and Howard Lyons.

The Fire Department now serves the Northern

part of Warren Township as well as the Village of Warren.

When the Department was first organized it secured a Model T chassis and equipped it for fire fighting purposes and then later added another Model T which was used for chemicals only but as time progressed and in keeping with the progress of the community a new Ford V-8 truck was purchased and this unit carries a 350-gallon tank which is used as a booster tank as is used for small fires, while the truck is large enough to carry 2500 feet of hose as well as the necessary ladders, hand extinguishers, axes and other equipment. The truck also has a suction pump for fighting fires where it is necessary to fight fires by pumping out of wells or ditches and the Department feels itself capable of extinguishing any normal fire which breaks out in its territory. The Department also stands ready to assist its neighbor department in case of an emergency.
