




The Little Ciant Cider Mill for \$7.65.

No. 18083. This is a strong, serviceable, and handy machine, the smallest, lightest, and cheapest made. The cutter



made. The cutter is made of tinned steel, and by its motion it cuts the fruit and carries off the cut apple before it touches any portion of the hopper or other metal, from which it might be stained. By the operation of the press the fruit is brought up with a screw and away from the cider. The Little Giantis not intended for

extensive cider making, but distinctively for family use, though its capacity is quite sufficient for making large quantities. Considering that it is operated by one person, its results will compare favorably with larger mills.
